LONDON. 22nd SEPTEMBER, 1916..

In reply to your telegram of 20th September re 1571 Johnston further result of enquiry still awaited meanwhile no evidence to show with 1st Battallion. Cannot be traced in hospital anywhere by latest reports has not been paid since June 26th. Sister in Devonshire last heard of him last June. Notwithstanding every exertion no official news therefore under circumstances Johnson to be regarded as unofficially missing. Casualties have been sent by telegraph and sent by mail to Government of Newfoundland as hitherto numbered consecutively so that non-delivery can be detected. Importance of reporting information concerning casualties appreciated fully see my letter of 11 July and 7 September. It is probable that casualties will be outstanding for many months. Have been endeavouring arrange that Anderson will accompany Major Paterson to 1st Battalion to clear various questions regarding casualties et cetera..

I have received your letter of the 7th instant, and beg to inform you in reply that every effort has been made to trace Private Johnson and, it is greatly to be regretted, with no success.

Looking to the length of time that has elapsed since Private Johnson was reported missing, and to the fact that his name has not appeared in any list of Prisoners of War received from Germany, I am regretfully constrained to conclude that Private Johnson is dead, and that his death occurred on or since the 1st day of July, 1918.

I am to express the deep sympathy and regret of the Newfoundland Government at your irreparable loss.

The late Private Johnson's next-of-kin is stated to be his father, whose address is your address. In the ordinary course of events he would be notified, but, as you have written, this letter in reply may be regarded as the official intimation.

If articles or personal property of the late Private Johnson are found, they will be forwarded to this Office, but some time may probably elapse before their receipt, and they will naturally be subject to customary formalities regarding effects.

Application regarding the disposal of personal effects or of any amount that may eventually be found due to the late soldier's estate, should be addressed to this office. Please convey these facts to Mr. Johnson.


