Dear Judge Johnson:-

In answer to your letter of October 10th concerning war medals due to MacGoss, I would state that in accordance with Army Orders, his medals are issuable by the Record Office of the 4th Cameron Highlanders, or possibly from the India Office, if he got his transfer to the Indian Army from the 4th Cameron Highlanders. While he was serving with the Newfoundland Regiment, he was still an officer of the Cameron Highlanders, and was merely attached to us for duty. This office would not receive the details of his service after he had gone to India. If he completed his probationship and secured his transfer to the Indian Army, then his application for war medals would go through the India Office. As he is no longer attached to any portion of the Service, I would suggest that the way to get the quickest reply and the prompt issue of the medals to which he is entitled would be by application to the Secretary of the War Office, Whitehall, addressing the communication to the Adjutant General's Department.

In addition to the 1914-15 Star which he states he has received, he is entitled to the British War Medal and Allies Medal. As far as I am acquainted with War Office Methods, I feel safe in stating that as he himself is in a position to apply for these medals, they will require him to fill up the application form which they will forward him when the matter has been put before them. Perhaps, as your letter has intimated, MacGoss would not take the matter up; and in that case I would suggest that you write to the War Office as above noted and give them his present address and the main particulars of his service, and ask them to forward the necessary form to him for completion and return.





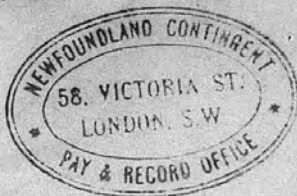
