
As Jones stated that his passage to this country was arranged and paid by the Newfoundland Government, payment of balance of War Service Gratuity was withheld pending the receipt of your reply 30/8/19 as to whether the cost of passage should be recovered from the Gratuity. It may be mentioned that whilst your telegram (2) 5/8/19 forms specific authority to pay the case of No. 1125 Pte. J.R. Merchant was in mind - hence the further telegrams from this office.

The following letter from him regarding Discharge Badge is also quoted:-

"I am enclosing the letter I had from the Headquarters at St. John's Nfld. last week. I sincerely hope you will help me to get my Gratuity as soon as possible, you know why I am in need of it, and I also wish to ask you if you can tell me the reason I have not received my discharge Badge. Will you kindly let me know where to enquire for it.

As all his documents have been forwarded to you and his discharge took place in Newfoundland, we are unable to say whether he is entitled to Silver War Badge. Kindly advise.
