

Dear Sir,

I regret to have to inform you that a report has this day been received from the Record Office of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, London, to the effect that #3355, Private Felix Jordan, is at 3rd Australian Casualty Clearing Station, France, March 14th, suffering from shell wound right arm, fractured humerus.



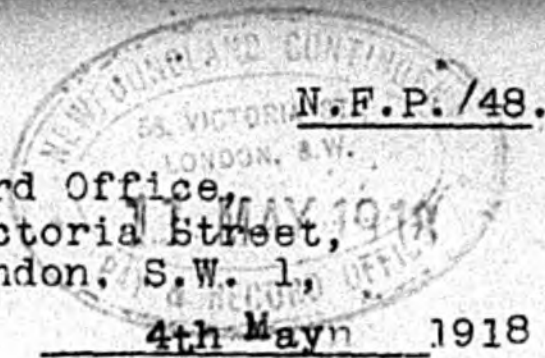
