



My dear mother,

Just a few lines letting you know how I am. You must be in a crew way to think that I was gone, but I am still well. I received your Cablegram on the 16th of this month and I thought you knew before this that I was a prisoner. Dear mother, I was talking to Ned about ten minutes before we went over the top on April 14th. He was happy enough then, the two of us sat down in Day trench and smoked a couple of cigarettes together and then we parted and I have never seen him since, and let me know if you hear anything of him. I wrote to you four months ago and I have not heard from you yet and when you get this letter please send me some money, and I asked for money and Parcels in my last letter I sent you. I think this is all at present so I must ring off.

Dear Madam,

With reference to your request, made in the early part of May last, that enquiries should be made of the Pay and Record Office authorities in London regarding a Money Order for £1 and a parcel both of which were addressed to your son, No. 2776, Private Jeremiah Joy at Ayr in December 1916, I beg to say that I am now in receipt of a reply to the communication which I addressed to Major Timewell, upon your lodging the complaint with me.

Upon the matter being brought by Major Timewell to the notice of the Commanding Officer at Ayr the latter reports that the parcel to which you refer was received at Ayr in a bad condition and was handed over to the Orderly Sergeant. It was tied together and re-addressed to Private Joy, in care of the British Expeditionary Force and, whilst awaiting posting, it was taken by some one and the contents removed.

No information can be had regarding the Money Order for £1.

I regret that the result of my enquiries is now more satisfactory.

Dear Madam,

Referring to my letter to you of the 23rd May last, with regard to the statement made by Private Leo Layman, that your son, No. 2776 Private Jeremiah Joy, officially reported missing, April 14th, had been wounded and placed in the same hospital as Private Layman, I beg to say that I am now in receipt of a letter from Major Timewell, of the Newfoundland Pay and Record Office, London, which states as follows:-

"No. 2284, Pte. L. Layman, 1/Newfoundland Regt. has been interrogated, and he states that he has made no mention in a letter that No. 2776, Joy, was admitted to hospital with him. The last he saw of him was on about April 14th, 1917, when he was proceeding to the Dressing Station, and he did not then appear to be seriously wounded. Private Layman says he was at the time in the company of Joy's brother, who should be able to corroborate his statement.

I may say that I am unable to understand Private Layman's statement, above quoted, in view of the letter from him which you produced at this office at the time when you first reported the matter.
