Dear Sir,

It was with the greatest regret that the Government received a cablegram from the Record Office, London, intimating that your son, Private William Joyce, had been killed in Action on the 8th September.

Permit me to express on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy with you at this time. While we all sorrow at the loss of loved ones, yet it will no doubt be some consolation to you to think that your boy loyally answered the Call of King and Country, fought bravely and well and fell with his face to the foe in defence of the principles of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty. He has laid down the earthly weapons of Warfare and now wears the Soldier's Crown of Victory. His name will be emblazoned upon the glorious Roll of Honour and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen. We are proud of our gallant lads and also of the noble fathers and mothers who so unselfishly gave their boys when the Call of Duty came. When the Victory has been won and Peace again reigns it will be a comfort to you to think that, in this great achievement, your gallant lad bore no small part, and gave of himself even to the uttermost.

I trust that you may have at this time the presence and consolation of the Great Father of us all.

Referring to your letter of April, 12th., to the Colonial Secretary I have been directed to inform you, that continuation of allotments of deceased soldiers is only made where the allotment, prior to a soldier's decease, has been payable to a parent or a relative who can show, that he or she is dependent upon the soldier concerned.

The instruction was given, therefore, to discontinue all allotments except those payable to parents, the view being taken, that if <sup>a</sup> sister<sup>s</sup> or other relatives to whom the allotment was payable, was dependent upon the soldier, <sup>she</sup> would apply for continuation of the allotment, and the matter would then be considered. In view of your application, I am enclosing a Form to be completed for the use of the Pensions & Disabilities Board, and as soon as this is received the matter of continuing the allotment will be dealt with.
