Would you kindly forward to the Pay & Record Office, London, the following in answer to the queries in their Memo 6722/261/P.& A:-

1.

Jupp should be paid full pension of \$40.00 while in Hospital. The extra allowance of \$20.00 was authorized on the understanding that Jupp was paying for Sanatorium treatment himself, as the War Office has put in a claim for cost of treatment, vide No. 3- the extra allowance should not be paid Jupp.

2. Continue full pension from time of his discharge from Hospital 14/7/18 to Dec. 31/19 at \$40.00 per month, and from Jany. 1st/19 to date of re-board at rate of \$50.00 per month.

3. As stated in No. 1. Allowance of \$20.00 per month is cancelled. B. P. C. undertake to pay full cost in case of discharged soldiers undergoing treatment in Hospital for a disability attributable to or aggravated by service when such treatment is taken under the Imperial Ministry of Pensions or War Office.



- (3) With regard to cost of treatment claim has now been received from the War Office and is made up at 6/- per day. In view of your telegram stating that the Pension Commissioners will pay for the cost of treatment up to \$1.50 per day, how is the allowance for upkeep of \$20.00 per month referred to in (1) to be applied?

As it appears that the Pension Commissioners undertake to pay the full cost in the case of discharged soldiers undergoing treatment in hospitals, etc, it would appear to be necessary in all future cases to have this clearly stated and the allowance for Upkeep of \$20.00 per month defined, so that this office may understand thoroughly what it is required to do; otherwise there is the possibility of hardship being inflicted on the pensioner.





Examination of Lungs showed signs of active disease at apex of Right lung. Since then he has undergone treatment in the surgical ward for enlarged tubercular glands.*

OPINION OF THE MEDICAL BOARD.

NOTES.—(i) Clear and definite answers are to be filled in by the Board, as, in the event of a man being invalided, it is essential that the Minister of Pensions should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable him to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

Expressions such as "may," "might," "probably," etc., are to be avoided.

(ii) The rates of pension vary according to whether the disability is (a) caused or aggravated by service in the present war. (b) Due to causes not connected with the present war, viz., (1) Previous active service. (2) Climatic diseases in pre-war service. (3) Ordinary military service before the war. It is, therefore, essential when assigning the cause of a disability to differentiate between them.

14. State whether the disabilities are (a) attributable to (b) aggravated by
