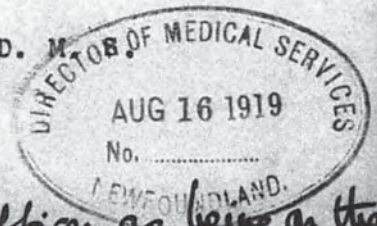

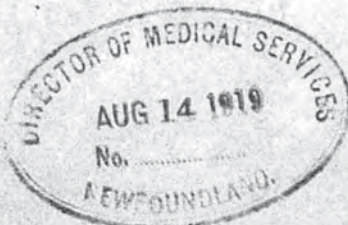

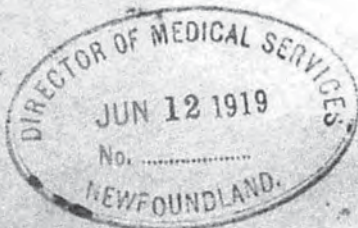

Sir:-

It is proposed to send the S.S. Terra Nova to Labrador on Thursday next, and as there has been a large amount of sickness on that Coast during the fall and winter the Government consider it essential that a Doctor should go down on the S.S. Terra Nova. It is difficult to get a Medical man, but the Government think that perhaps you may be able to arrange for one of the Doctors in connection with the Department of Militia making this trip in the Terra Nova. Please endeavour to arrange this.

The Doctor would require to get a supply of drugs to take with him, selecting such as he thinks would be necessary under the circumstances. These could be procured at O'Mara's Drug Store, near the Long Bridge and could be packed and sent on board the steamer. Such other arrangements as may be necessary could be carried out by the Doctor as time is short and the necessity is urgent.

With reference to your letter 24/P/565 (A.M.D.I.) 19/2/19 (1588) and telephonic conversation with Capt. Gardiner of this morning in view of the fact that Capt S.G. Kean one of the Newfoundland Officers mentioned in this office letter No 2345/4/Demob. 11/2/19, is being demobilized and proceeding to Newfoundland shortly it has been thought advisable to substitute him for Capt. W.E. Procunier whom you recalled from France. Two telegrams dated 3/3/19 and 5/3/19 were despatched to the O.i/c. Repatriation Records Winchester asking for authority to provide passage to Newfoundland for the former but no reply has yet been received: meanwhile his passage has been provisionally booked for 12/3/19.

With regard to Capt. Procunier it is now desired he should be attached as Medical Officer to the 2/bn. Royal Newfoundland Regt. Hazeley Down Camp, Winchester. It is understood he will be granted a short period of leave and report there on or about 17/3/19. This officer will continue to hold his commission in the R.A.M.C. i.e. he will not be transferred to the Royal Newfoundland Regt., but merely attached for duty to the Unit mentioned in the foregoing as in the case of R.A.M.C.
