Sir,

#2913 Corp. Cooper reported to me that on Saturday morning Oct. 28/16 at 3.00 a.m., while he was Acting Sergt. of Guard, the sentry called him to see a light that was moving in the sky. The Corporal saw the light and called other members of the Guard to witness it: he claimed that the light moved upwards and downwards during its travel through the air and circled round before leaving their sight.

#2869 L/Cpl. T. J. Kean reported to me that he saw a light moving about in the sky. From information given by the sentry he was inclined to think it was a seaplane or some form of airship as the sentry claimed he heard the noise of the engine.






