I understood I was placed on the reserve list of officers on March 31st/19 and was told that I could leave the country and my papers etc. would be sent to the above address. I have now been here nearly 2 months and have received no word.

Then again, my wife will be coming to Canada on or about the last of July or at the latest, the first week in August and I can foresee difficulties with the 'Customs' with no papers to show I am a returned soldier.



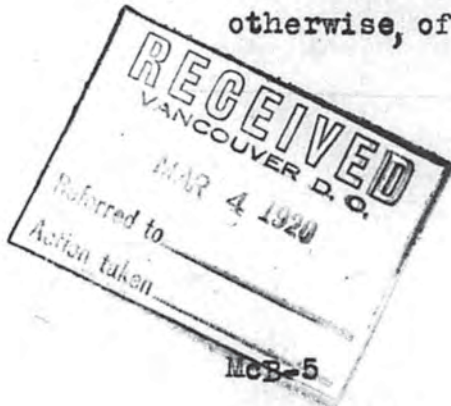
