

Some time ago I received a communication from you informing me that my letter with reference to my pension and to travelling expense money to New York would be answered shortly. Up to date, I have received no further communication from the Militia Department, but as the mail service is extremely poor this does not surprise me.

As you, no doubt, have been informed, I have been examined by Medical Board here and the finding was that I was given a three-fifth disability. I do not know what the ^{cor-}responding pension is, but I take it that it would be a fair remuneration for the loss of power that I have sustained owing to my wounds.

It is now necessary for me to enter hospital for another operation and I hope that the Pensions Board will see It's way clear to assume the responsibility for hospital expenses. This, at any rate, is the recommendation of Dr. Crile the Surgeon who is to operate on me and Dr. Thomas the British Medical authority in Cleveland.

While the doctors are very hopeful they seem to think it will be some time before I can get fit and so I am working for a Bond Corporation on Broadway. Of course I am only at the very beginning and it will take a little while but for the present I am learning. Though the pay to start with is not good still the experience is excellent and it is something that will prove of value to me. In the meantime if you will manage to fix these matters up it would help greatly. Hoping you & the rest of the

Some time ago I wrote the Hon. J. R. Bennett, Minister of Militia with reference to my pension and also to the refunding of my passage money to New York which he had undertaken to do before I left Newfoundland. My object in going to New York was to receive medical treatment for wounds received in service and the Minister agreed at the time to pay my traveling expenses there and back, so I put in a claim for \$125.00. I would be very grateful indeed if you could do something in the matter. The Chief of Staff, Colonel Rendell will doubtless be able to give you all necessary information.

In regard to my pension, though I have written twice on the subject I have not received any intimation that any award has been made as the result of M. B. held in Long Island College Hospital last May. Though I fully understand that you must be extremely busy as a result of reconstruction problems, I would ask you to set the necessary machinery in motion so that I may receive my pension. As you know I am much handicapped as a result of wounds received in active service and I think that fair remuneration is due me.

Hoping and believing that the department is progressing very satisfactorily under its new head and that you will let me know your ruling on these matters, I remain

Under these circumstances I am to request that you will ascertain and report to this Office, with the least possible delay, when you will be in a position to give this officer accommodation on a hospital ship to Newfoundland, should you consider from the opinion expressed by the officers who examined Captain Keegan on February 4th that the voyage or the journey overland through the United States to Newfoundland would be in any way detrimental to his recovery, and that you will be so good as to inform this Office of the probable dates of sailings of hospital ships to Newfoundland, within the next three months.

If, therefore, it is impossible to accommodate Captain Keegan in a hospital ship within the next few months, he will be retained in hospital during that period and he will be brought before another medical board on or about April 5th in order that the question of his return to Newfoundland may be reviewed.
