Dear Sir:

Some time ago I received a communication from you inf me that my letter with reference to my pension and to travelling expense money to New York would be answered shortly. Up to date, I have received no further communication from the Militia Department, but as the mail service is extremely poor this does not surprise me.

As you, no doubt, have been informed, I have been examined by Medical Board here and the finding was that I was given a three-fifth disability. I do not know what the responding pension is, but I take it that it would be a fair remaneration for the loss of power that I have sustained owing to my wounds.

It is now necessary for me to enter hospital for another operation and I hope that the Pensions Board will see It's way clear to assume the responsibility for hospital expenses. This, at any rate, is the recommendation of Dr. Crile the Surgeon who is to operate on me and Dr. Thomas the British Medical authority in Cleveland.

As you know I am much handicapped as a result of wounds received in active service and I think that fair remuneration is due me.



I am directed to forward the enclosed copies of Medical Boards held on Captain K.J.Keegan, M.C., 1st Newfoundland Regiment, and to point out that this officer has been recommended by the Medical Board dated 4th February, 1918, to be allowed to return to Newfoundland.

It will be seen from the answer to question 14 that the recommendation is qualified by the opinion that he should travel as a cot case.

Under these circumstances I am to request that you will ascertain and report to this Office, with the least possible delay, when you will be in a position to give this officer accommodation on a hospital ship to Mowfoundland, should you consider from the opinion expressed by the officers who examined Captain Keegan on February 4th that the voyage or the journey overland through the United States to Newfoundland would be in-anyway detrimental to his recovery, and that you will be so good as to inform this Office of the probable dates of sailings of hospital ships to Newfoundland, within the next three months.

If, therefore, it is impossible to accommodate Captain Keegan in a hospital ship within the next few months, he will be retained in hospital furing that period and he will be brought before another medical board on or about April 5th in order that the question of his return to Newfoundland may be reviewed.





It will be seen from the answer to question 14 that the recommendation is qualified by the opinion that he should travel as a cot case.






