Notes.—(i.) 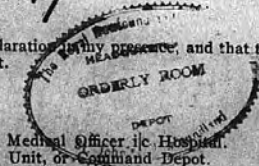

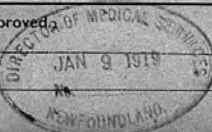


