
With reference to your letter of 19th ulto. it would appear that I have misinterpreted your letter of 16/12/19. I inferred that the maximum grant was £1. 9s. 7d., but in view of your letter I have issued payment at the rate of £2. 7s. 4d. per week from 16/12/19 to the present time.

I also append a note of my payments on the case to date. I infer that it is now proposed to take over Kennell's payments centrally. In their instructions to me of 8th November last my Headquarters stated that allowances would not be payable by my Committee in this case, as the man's pension would continue to be paid by the Newfoundland Government. I shall, of course, be glad to assist in any way possible, but I see no reason why these allowances should not be sent to Kennell direct by you as he is only on out-patient treatment, and is travelling to Glasgow once a week for out-patient treatment at the Psycho-Therapeutic Clinic at the Victoria Infirmary, Glasgow under Dr. Marshall.

I do not know as yet what the hospital charges may be for the treatment of this man, but if you will indicate your wishes in the matter I shall communicate with Dr Marshall, and ask him to communicate with you direct in regard to payment of the cost of treatment. The position in this case has been a little unfortunate. It was apparently not brought to anyone's notice until the termination of the Out-of-work Donation, but matters now appear to be in order.
