It was with the greatest regret that the Government received a cable from the Record Office, London, reporting that your son, Private Alexander King, had died of wounds at the 24th General Hospital, Etaples, on the 4th September.

Permit me to express to you on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy in this time of sorrow. But though we feel the parting and though the heart is heavy with its loss, yet it is a glorious thing to think that your gallant boy early responded to the call of duty and made his stand for the establishment of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty upon the earth. We are all proud of our brave and noble boys but no less do we esteem the unselfish fathers and mothers who so willingly gave their boys when the call of duty came. Though your boy has laid down his earthly weapons he wears the soldier's Crown of Victory and his name will be inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and will be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen. When the end of this war comes and an honourable and abiding Peace will have been established, it will be your proud thought that your dear boy did to the utmost of his ability to bring about such result. I trust that the Great Father may give you of his love and comfort at this time.

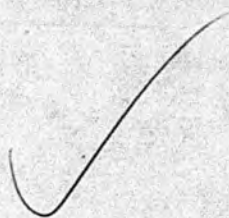





You will not require a passport, and you can go direct to *Folkestone* taking this letter with you, but you must inform me by ~~Southampton~~ telegram *without delay* of the date on which you propose to travel, otherwise you may be delayed at the Port. (Relations proceeding to Boulogne should cross from Folkestone by the morning boat service if possible.)

5. You must ask for the Embarkation Commandant and show him this letter.

6. You must go within seven days of the date at the top of this letter.

7. You must keep this letter until you return to England, when you will hand it over to the Embarkation Commandant at the Port of Arrival.

12. Your relation or friend should proceed with you to <sup>Folkestone</sup>~~Southampton~~ at his or her own expense, and there apply to the Embarkation Commandant for a Permit to accompany you to France.

13. The Embarkation Commandant will, if he is satisfied as to his or her identity, issue such Permit. He will arrange for your relation or friend to travel at the public expense, for the remainder of the outward journey, and for the return journey, if the relation or friend will sign a certificate to say that he or she cannot afford to pay his or her own expenses.

14. Your relation or friend will be accommodated free of charge whilst in France.

With reference to Circular Letter 14/Gen. No./5641 (Q.M.G. 2) of the 16th September, and former correspondence on the subject of visits to officers and soldiers in hospital in France, I am commanded by the Army Council to inform you that, in future, all relations of *soldiers* who are permitted to visit them will, if they are not able to pay their own expenses be sent out to France at the public expense, and accommodated during their stay there free of charge.

2. All telegrams will be sent to Officers in Charge of Records from this Office (C. 2, Casualties) and none will be sent by the Base Commandants, and it will be understood that the words "may be visited" imply "at public expense."

3. The Officer in Charge of Records in his telegram to the next-of-kin should, after reporting the condition of the soldier, &c., add as follows:—

"He may be visited, and should you be unable to bear expense you will be sent out at public expense. Telegraph whether you wish to go and whether able to bear expense or not."

4. On receipt of a reply from the next-of-kin that he or she wishes to go and cannot bear the expense of the journey, the Officer in Charge of Records will forward, by the first post, amended Army Form B 104-108 (copy enclosed) together with a railway warrant, and to the Embarkation Commandant, Southampton, or the Assistant Embarkation Commandant, Folkestone, by the same post, Army Form B 104-114.

5. On receipt of the information, as to the date and boat service by which the relation proposes to proceed, the Officer in Charge of Records will telegraph accordingly to the Embarkation Commandant, Southampton, or the Assistant Embarkation Commandant, Folkestone,

and will also telegraph to the Base Commandant, Havre or Boulogne, in the following terms:—

In the event of the recipient of Army Form B 104-108 being accompanied by another relation or a friend under the conditions laid down in paragraphs 10-16 of amended Army Form B 104-108, the Officer in Charge of Records will, on being informed of the Christian names and surnames of the relation or friend, and if a relation of his or her relationship to the soldier, telegraph the same, *without delay* to the Assistant Embarkation Commandant, Folkestone, and telegraph the necessary information to the Base Commandant, Havre or Boulogne.

7. The Embarkation Commandant will inform the Officer in Charge of Records of the embarkation of the second relation or the friend, in order that a refund may be made of the cost of his or her journey to the port of embarkation, as provided for in paragraph 15 of amended Army Form B 104-108.

8. Paragraphs 11-16 of amended Army Form B 104-108 cancel the instructions contained in the last paragraph of Circular Letter 14/Gen. No./5641 (Q.M.G. 2) of the 16th September.

9. The following list shows the ports to which relations should be sent for the different hospitals:—

10. With reference to paragraph 10 of Circular Letter 14/Gen. No./5641, Q.M.G. 2, of the 27th July last, the following

amendments should be made by the Officer in Charge of Records to the telegram despatched to the relation of an Officer of the Territorial Force:—

Cancel "Nobody else may go with you," and in the case of a relation proceeding to Boulogne, add—

"Telegraph to Commandant, Boulogne, as long as possible beforehand, date and boat service by which you proceed. Morning boat service should be used if possible."

11. If an application is received for a second visitor to proceed, it will be refused if not in accordance with the conditions in Army Form B 104-108. If it accords with those conditions, a second telegram will be issued to the second relative if the case is under 10 (1), or a telegram to the first relative giving permission for him or her to be accompanied if the case is under 10 (11).

I am commanded by the Army Council to inform you of the following amended regulations with regard to visits of soldiers' relatives to hospitals overseas. The amendments are due to the Foreign Office having agreed to waive the necessity for obtaining passports in all such cases.

I.—SOLDIERS' RELATIONS.

2. As regards cases in which relations travel at the public expense, as well as those in which relations proceed at their own expense, Officers i/c Records should be instructed that, in future, each letter sent to a relation should give the full Christian names and surname of the soldier (but not his number, rank, regiment or corps) and the name and place of the hospital in which he is a patient, and should state that permission has been given for the relation in question to visit the soldier at that hospital.

3. The relation should, in each case, be instructed to preserve the letter from the Record Office and produce it, within seven days of its date, to the Embarkation Commandant at the port of embarkation, who will endorse it.

4. The letter so endorsed will be sufficient authority to enable the relation to land at a base port, without being provided with a passport. It should be retained by the relation until his or her return to England, when it should be handed to the Embarkation Commandant or his representative at the port of disembarkation.

5. In order to guard against impersonation, the relation will be questioned by the Embarkation Commandant as to the number, rank, and regiment or corps of the soldier, and this is the reason why these particulars should not be given in the letter from the Officer i/c Records.

[6. Relations

6. *Relations travelling at the public expense.*

A. The instructions issued in War Office letter of the 18th June and previous correspondence numbered as above, will hold good, except as amended by this letter.

B. In order to obviate relations being held up at the port of embarkation, they should be instructed to inform this Office of the day on which, and boat service by which, they propose to cross: two clear days beforehand if the notice is sent by letter, and one clear day beforehand if the notice is sent by telegram.

7. *Relations travelling at their own expense.*

The following regulations A and B in the letter of June 2nd, 14/Gen. No./5698 to Record Offices will hold good, C D and E being new regulations, and an amended edition of Army Form B. 104—108 (copy enclosed) will shortly be issued to Officers i/c Records, when all copies of the original Form should be destroyed.

A. In future, in all cases of dangerous illness in hospitals in France, those cases in which the relations may visit the soldier will be distinguished in the telegram sent to the Record Office from this Office by the addition of the words "may be visited." As it is not desirable, however, to encourage the relations of soldiers to journey to France at their own expense, the telegram from the Record Office conveying the news of the dangerous illness to the next-of-kin should conclude "He may be visited but not at the public expense—letter follows." A copy of Army Form B. 104—108 should be at once posted to the next-of-kin.

In all cases of dangerous illness where the words "may be visited" are *not* added, the telegram from the Record Office should conclude with the words "regret permission to visit him cannot be granted," and Army Form B. 104—108 should not be sent.

B. In notifying cases of *serious* (as distinct from dangerous) illness, which should be by post and not by telegram, the words "it is regretted that permission to visit the soldier cannot be granted" should be added to Army Form B. 104—80.

C. The Officer i/c Records will tell the relation to go to Southampton if the hospital is at Rouen, Havre or Etretat, and to Folkestone if it is elsewhere, and he must alter Army Form B. 104—108 accordingly. He must notify the Embarkation Commandant, Southampton, or the Assistant Embarkation Commandant, Folkestone, on Army Form B. 104—114 (copy enclosed) by the same post by which he writes to the relation.

D. Army Form B. 104—108 will always be sent to the next-of-kin, except in cases in which some other person is specified in the telegram from this office.

E. Every precaution should be taken to prevent an improper use being made of Army Form B 104—114, supplies of which will be issued shortly to all Officers i/c Records.

## II.—OFFICERS' RELATIONS.

8. The principles laid down in paragraphs 1—5 apply to the relations of Officers equally with those of soldiers.

### *Officers other than those of the Territorial Force.*

9. The telegrams to the relations and to the Embarkation Commandants will be sent direct from this office.

### *Officers of the Territorial Force.*

10. The notification to the relation should be made by telegram by the Officer i/c Records in the following form :—
