"Newfoundland Regiment on an  
"Overseas Scholarship. I came  
"here January past. My own pay  
"has been stopped since I left  
"the Regiment but I thought sure  
"my allotment would go on as  
"usual, but yesterday I received  
"a letter from my mother saying  
"it was stopped. Please Sir, can  
"you tell me whose orders it was  
"to stop it? I really consider  
"it an injustice. I am away  
"from home on Overseas, or  
"active service, and am not dis-  
"charged so I think my allotment  
"at least should go on as before.  
"I am the only one from the  
"Regiment, and my allotment does  
"not mean or add much to the  
"total expenses of the Regiment,  
"but it means a lot for me. My  
"Scholarship is only worth £250.0.0.  
"and it is not enough to pay my  
"College expenses here for a year,  
"so my allotment was the only  
"thing I had to fall back on. My  
"father is only a fisherman, and I  
"cannot expect or take much help  
"from him, he kept me at school  
"and College as long as he  
"possibly could in Newfoundland and  
"I am over 21 years of age so  
"I cannot expect much help from  
"him. I have already had about  
"£100.00 sent across to help me

"along. Please, Sir, if there is  
"any possibility could you arrange  
"for my allotment to go on as  
"before. By doing so I would be  
"greatly obliged. Thanking you

Minutes of correspondence regarding this soldier are submitted for your consideration. Kindly instruct by telegram as to whether King should receive pay in accordance with the Canadian ruling.

With regard to War Service Gratuity: The amount to which he will be entitled will be governed by your ruling on the question of Pay as the service which counts towards Gratuity will be only that period for which he receives Pay and Allowances. (See Canadian Rulings Note (A)).

It may be added that King was employed in this office during his vacation last year for which period he was paid by this office at the rates applicable. During his present vacation he is employed by the High Commissioner and is being paid by him. This soldier's discharge is being proceeded with and dates will be advised to you in due course.

Sir,

With reference to your letter dated July 31st (10081/19&A) I enclose a copy of a letter addressed to you on 29th April. I regret that I have not now a copy of the communication referred to in paragraph three of that letter.

The Overseas Military Council of Canada, by Decision 294 15th March 1919 authorised issue of pay and allowances to all Canadian personnel holding scholarships, and attending British Universities. Authority for the decision was granted understanding that the courses in question terminated June 1919. The Council decided 22nd July 1919, that scholars who had not completed their course should now be permitted to take their discharge in the British Isles: repatriation to be arranged by the High Commissioner for Canada.

Sir,

As the majority of Colonial Soldiers have been reappriated and discharged and a period of demobilisation nearing completion, I shall have to take my discharge in this country in order to complete my studies and the period of my scholarship.

As you are aware, I was granted an Overseas Scholarship under the Rhodes Trustees in January 1918 while serving with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment. I was then granted a year's leave from the Regiment and proceeded to Oxford University. In January, 1919, I was granted a second year's leave which expires in January 1920, with my scholarship.

Before taking my discharge I would like, with your permission to make application through you to the Minister of Militia for full War Service Gratuity since my enlistment in October, 1916.

Although I have been temporarily struck off the strength of the Regiment, yet I have been and still am directly under the Military. I was sent to Oxford by the Newfoundland Military, they had first claim over me even a prior claim to the University. they, (Military Authorities) reserved to themselves the power to cancel my leave and send me to France or elsewhere whenever they chose. Consequently I have been on active service from a Colonial point of view since leaving Newfoundland.

My scholarship was only of the value of £250. per annum and in view of the high cost of living, coupled with high charges at the 'Versity, I have had to spend practically all the little sum I saved previous to the War. This leaves me rather low financially.

In order to finish my course at Oxford I will have to stay until June 1920, and to do so I shall have to reply upon receiving my War Service Gratuity. Except I am granted the full amount from the time of my enlistment I will have to abandon my course before it is completed which will have a detrimental effect upon my future.

I am making this appeal feeling confident that it will not be in vain and that it will receive your best consideration. I have made good since being at the University and it would be very disastrous now if I have to give up my studies being so near the goal because of lack of funds: and especially after having fought for my country during the great crisis.

I have received no pay from the Regiment since I was sent to Oxford. I am the only overseas scholar from Newfoundland and the amount I now ask for, which conscientiously I think I am entitled to, means a very minute sum to the Government yet it would be very beneficial to me and would enable me to complete my University education.

I may mention in passing that the Canadian Government decided last January to grant pay and allowances to their soldiers on scholarships at Oxford dating from February 1st. 1919. I have received none, although Colonel Lascelles, organising secretary of the Overseas Scholarships, took up the matter on my behalf and ask the Newfoundland Government if they would be good enough to grant me the same concession, but up to the time of writing I have had no reply from the Newfoundland Government.

In view of the above facts I feel sure that the proper Authorities will not turn a deaf ear to this appeal, especially from one who has sacrificed all to fight for his country in her time of need.

I would therefore humbly beg of you to give this matter your best consideration, please, and let me have a reply at your earliest convenience.

EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES.

With reference to your memorandum of the 11th inst., 10361/6/P & A addressed to the Secretary C.M.F.C. the instructions issued from this Office to the Paymaster General Overseas Military Forces of Canada on Decision No 284. of the Overseas Military Council of Canada is repeated below for your information.

Officers and Other Ranks attending Universities with Scholarships are to be permitted to draw the pay of their rank exclusive of all allowances except Separation Allowance, if payable.

The rates are as follows and will be issuable as from 1st February 1919 and for the remaining portion of their respective courses:-

Lieutenants	.....\$2.00 per day.
Sergeants.	..... 1.35 per day
Corporals.	.....1.10 per day
Privates	.....1.00 per day

Decision No 237. 15.1.19 of the Overseas Military Forces of Canada authorised a certain number of Officers and men to take advantage of Educational Facilities offered by British Universities through the Khaki University of Canada. In this connection instructions were issued from this Office that such personnel to be placed in British Universities for the Spring Term commencing immediately and completing in six months would be granted leave with pay and field allowance of rank (also Separation Allowance if payable) plus Subsistence Allowance as and where payable for the period of their courses.

In the case of personnel who were in receipt, of any special or consolidated rate of pay prior to going on these courses, instructions were given that the higher rates would be restored to them from the date of termination of their courses.

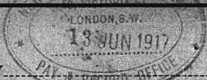

They, (Military Authorities) reserved to themselves the power to cancel my leave and send me to France or elsewhere whenever they chose. Consequently I have been on active service from a Colonial point of view since leaving Newfoundland.

Except I am granted the full amount from the time of my enlistment I will have to abandon my course before it is completed which will have a detrimental effect upon my future.

I am making this appeal feeling confident that it will not be in vain and that it will receive your best consideration. I have made good since being at the University and it would be very disastrous now if I have to give up my studies being so near the goal because of lack of funds; and especially after having fought for my country during the great crisis.

I have received no pay from the Regiment since I was sent to Oxford. I am the only overseas scholar from Newfoundland and the amount I now ask for, which conscientiously I think I am entitled to, means a very minute sum to the Government yet it would be very beneficial to me and would enable me to complete my University education.

I may mention in passing that the Canadian Government decided last January to grant pay and allowances to their soldiers on scholarships at Oxford dating from February 1st. 1919. I have received none, although Colonel Lascelles, organising secretary of the Overseas Scholarships, took up the matter on my behalf and ask the Newfoundland Government if they would be good enough to grant me the same concession, but up to the time of writing I have had no reply from the Newfoundland Government.

Lord Selborne wishes me to let you know that the Hon. Sir Arthur Stanley, Chairman of the Joint War Committee of the British Red Cross Society and the Order of St. John of Jerusalem in England acting on behalf of the Executive Committee of the Lord Kitchener National Memorial Fund for Disabled Officers and men of the Navy and Army has informed Lord Selborne that that Committee is desirous of enabling a certain number of officers and men of the Overseas Naval and Military forces who may appropriately benefit from the fund to take up "Overseas Sailor and Soldier Scholarships" tenable for one year at the British Universities and higher Technological institutions. I am in receipt of your letter of the 20th of Feb., asking for further particulars concerning the scholarship awarded to #3175 Pte. Andrew J. King. I am sure from your letter that this scholarship is not understood by you, and I have much pleasure in explaining more fully.

Certain funds were placed at the disposal of Lord Selbourne to be expended in the provision of scholarships, tenable for one year, at the University of Oxford. This scholarship was available for overseas soldiers and sailors, medically unfit for further service in the field or at sea, it was required that candidates must have (a) graduated at an overseas university, (b) had their studies at an overseas university interrupted by the call of service, or (c) passes examinations of university entrance standard.

Each scholarship is of the value of \$250, being sufficient to cover all expenses of scholar including tuition fees and cost of living.

One such scholarship was available for a Newfoundland soldier or sailor, and # 3175 Pte. A.J.King was the man chosen out of all the Newfoundland Forces as being suitable to be offered this splendid opportunity and to do credit to Newfoundland.

While at St. John's school and Bishop Field College, Pte. King

Feb. 25, 18.

Apparently, did particularly well with his studies. It is noted that his school distinctions are:- in the Preliminary Grade, Honours, in the intermediate grade, first division. He obtained his degree as an Associate of Arts on the 31st of July, 1913. In recommending this soldier for the scholarship his Officer Commanding made the following remarks:- "I strongly recommend this case. King is a very good type and his best points in that he is honest, brave and intelligent ----- are very representative of a Dominion which has sent so many of his kind to the War. He is every inch a Newfoundlander."


I am enclosing a memorandum which will bear out my explanation, and perhaps help to make the case clearer.

It is evident from your letter that you think that he is being posted away from the battalion on detached duty, such however is not the case. He has been given the honour of being chosen as the only one of the Newfoundland Forces to take one years tuition at Oxford University. It is an opportunity which he would not otherwise have had, and I am sure when you get his further letters, you will see that it is for him the chance of a life time.

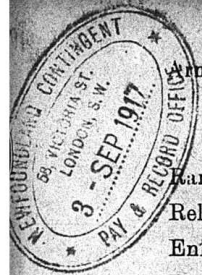
