

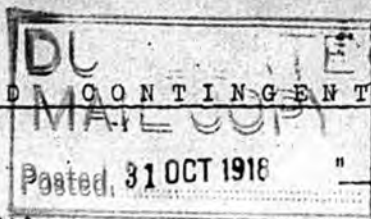

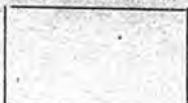

NOTES.—(i.)
