Dear Madam,

It was with great regret that the Government received a report, through His Excellency the Governor, that your dear son, Private James William King, who had gone forward to do his part for his King and Country, had been invalided from Ayr, in Scotland, and while returning to his home had Died at Sea on board the ss. SICILIAN.

Permit me to express to you on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, heartfelt sympathy with you in this time of sorrow. Your gallant boy had come forward at the call of Duty and was willing to give to his utmost in defence of the Principles of Righteousness, Truth and Justice. While we sorrow for those whom we love when they leave us, yet it is some consolation to realize that they have died in such a glorious cause. While your brave lad was not privileged to actually take part in the fighting, yet he did all that was possible, and he will rank among the heroes of his Island home who have come forward so nobly and given their lives in the defence of all that is good and true. His name will be inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow countrymen. I pray that you may have the Presence and Consolation of the Great Father of us all at this time.


