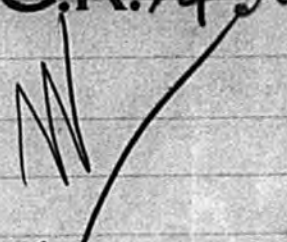



I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of May 29th, in which you point out the fact that your son, #2430 Pte. W.J. King, who has been Missing since April 14th 1917, is now posted as Killed in Action April 14th 1918. This is a clerical error, and our letter to you of May 23rd should read: "Killed in Action on the 14th of April 1917."

With regard to your inquiry as to what authority the International Red Cross had for reporting your son, as Killed in Action on April 14th 1917, I may say that our records show as follows:

"The Committee, International Red Cross, Geneva, forwards April 5th/18 statement of #2280 W.J. Frampton, Royal Newfoundland Regiment, made at Heilsberg on the 16th of December, in relation to #2430 Signaller W.J. King, who was posted as Missing April 14th 1917. He states: Signaller King was Killed in Action April 14/17."

We have no further particulars than those, but we have asked the Record Office, London, to make further inquiries, and upon receipt of a reply, we shall again communicate with you.

entirely dependent upon Reg. No.
2430 W. J. King does not ^{have} his
separation allowance? I can truly
certify that she was depending ^{upon} him.
Because her husband died in Aug 1910
when I was 20, W. J. King 16, I was
then teaching and getting barely
enough to exist, and then had to try
to get ahead, W. J. King was a
fisherman with other parties

and made barely enough to keep
 the wolf from the door.
 Therefore when
 he enlisted, mother was
 left almost penniless.

I don't think it is fair for
 her to be treated in this way
 she is a widow woman
 and absolutely unable to
 look out for her rights, as
 she cannot write her
