





Dear Mr. Harris:

As you are aware, Sudbury Hospital has been taken over by your Department and the Board of Pension Commissioners, with effect from July 1st. There are apparently one or two outstanding matters which have not been finalised by the Colonial Secretary: One is the matter of payment to the Ward Aides, and another in connection with payment to Miss Buckley; but these two matters are, I understand, being arranged by the Pension Board and will not concern your Department. There is, however, the matter of Major Knight's position. Major Knight's services as far as this Department is concerned are no longer required, and he is due for demobilisation, so that the question of his salary and his duties at Sudbury Hospital require consideration. It is desirable that this matter should be settled at as early a date as possible, as he should be demobilised immediately. I should be glad if you will give this your special consideration, so that he would not be in the position of being struck off strength and still not receiving pay for his duties as Medical Supt. of the Hospital.

Civilian Medical Practitioners desiring to serve at home or abroad as Surgeons with the Army should communicate with the Secretary, War Office, London, S.W.

Gentlemen accepted for such service will be granted the temporary rank of Lieutenant in the Army and must fulfil the following conditions:-

1. They must be registered practitioners.
2. They must engage for a period of 12 Calendar months or until their services are no longer required, whichever shall first happen.
3. Their pay to be twenty-four shillings a day, inclusive of all money allowances, except travelling allowances and expenses when travelling on duty.
4. They will be granted free passages to and from any country abroad to which they may be sent.
5. They must devote their whole time to Military Service.
6. They will receive an allowance of £30 in respect of the provision of outfit, and a gratuity of £30 at the termination of their engagement if they have rendered satisfactory service.
7. They must furnish:-
  - (a) A statement of any previous service with the Army.
  - (b) The names of two persons of position and responsibility for reference as to character. [Governor of Newfoundland]

Reference your telegram 232 of 15-3-19, much inconvenience was caused by Major Knight's non arrival on Saturday last.

In accordance with arrangements made with him and at his suggestion, I collected a certain number of men who had to appear before a Medical Board - including one officer who had to leave his employment to get here - these will have to be examined at a future date.

Though the cases of the men are of no immediate urgency unless you should require them for repatriation those of the officers for discharge in this Country are - and if Major Knight's Hospital duties prevent his coming here to Board them other arrangements will be necessary, and I should be glad if you will make them. I do not see my way ~~to~~ recalling the other officers from their civil employment unless I know definitely that the Medical Board for their examination will be present on their arrival - It is always possible to inform Major Knight by telephone on Friday afternoon if there are any urgent cases for Boarding on the following day.

Noted. This is much regretted and it is hoped that there will be no recurrence.

Major Knight states that the arrangements made were that he was to be informed each Friday whether his presence at Hazeley Down Camp for the purpose of holding Medical Boards was necessary. On Friday last, 14th inst., no instructions had been received for him, and he therefore assumed that he was not required.

The D.A.D.M.S. finds, that since arrival here, that it is of importance for him to be in attendance at the classes at Shepherds Bush on Saturdays as well as during the week, but he is prepared to waive this and be present at the Camp each week-end in future.

In accordance with my telegram of 18/3/19, Major Knight will report to hold a Medical Board on Saturday 22nd inst., and it is hoped that confirmation of arrangements will then be made by him in consultation with you.

Sir:-

I have the honour to state that recently in conversation with the Chief Staff Officer I learned that the Royal Red Cross lately gazetted for Miss Emma Reid, who was Matron of the Military Hospital for nine months, had really been intended for the present Matron.

At the Chief Staff Officer's suggestion I saw His Excellency and asked his permission to state the case so that we might see if by any chance a mistake had been made. I mentioned that I did not wish in any way to appreciate the work done by Miss Emma Reid, who was first Matron at the Military Hospital, but that I did wish to call to his attention the much longer, more arduous and equally good service rendered by the present Matron.

I said that I had hoped that if any distinctions were to be given that they might be for overseas service as it seems that nurses who had enlisted and crossed the ocean during war time should take precedence in any honour list to any who remained at home on the same, or generally higher, salaries.

I stated that I had never at any time been asked for a report by the late Minister of Militia on the relative merits of the various Nurses.

The omission of Miss Mary Mahoney's name from the list has been so pronounced that it is my hope that some acknowledgment might be obtained for her. At the same time, if possible, I should like to put forward the name of Miss Daisy Sterling who has rendered long and devoted service as a V.A.D.

While dealing with this matter I desire to bring to your notice the conditions under which our Overseas Medical Service has been carried on. For this purpose I attach a copy of a letter in which I reviewed this matter to the Director General of the Medical Services.

This arrangement was made because it would have been extremely cumbersome for Newfoundland to endeavour to serve a single Regiment in the Field. On our side the expense would have been great and our men; if all passed through one hospital under the Newfoundland Staff, would have missed the great and varied specialised service which has grown up with the War, but the result has been that the Newfoundland Medical Service has not in the split up, scattered state received anything like the amount of recognition which might reasonably have been expected to come to the Colony's Forces had they been working as a Unit.

I bring this matter to your notice now, Sir, hoping that you will be able to take it up with His Excellency the Governor who assures me of his wish to see the matter put right.

Sir:-

I have the honour to refer to conversation which I had with you in April 1915 and in October 1916 with reference to arrangements with regard to the Newfoundland Medical Services.

May I call to your mind that the question was then discussed as to whether Newfoundland should equip a hospital unit of some sort to undertake the care of all Newfoundland sick and wounded.

At the first interview I had the honour to inform you that Newfoundland had sent Overseas one Regiment, and contemplated sending medical men, trained nurses and V.A.D's and supporting through the St. John's Ambulance Association a number of Hospital beds.

In April 1915 you expressed the opinion that it would be difficult to arrange a hospital unit to attend to the needs of but one Regiment, and to do the needed for them in all states: wounded, sick, special treatment and convalescence. You also pointed out the advantages of falling in with the general scheme of treatment of the army, with its great General Hospitals, eminent Specialists, &c. You advised that if we fell in with this advice all medical details coming over should enlist direct into the Royal Army Medical Corps, Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service Reserve and Joint Voluntary Aid Department of the Order of St. John and British Red Cross.

You were kind enough to promise further that should we wish to nominate any of these Officers for service with the Newfoundland Regiment as Regimental Medical Officer you would have him so appointed.

In interview of October 1916 the whole question was reopened when I reported to you the number of details we had spent

over. I again had questions asked from Newfoundland re the formation of a Newfoundland Hospital for treatment of the Newfoundland Regiment but had had sufficient experience in the field to realize the impracticability of such a scheme.

You were kind enough to again weigh the matter carefully and concluded that it would be best for us to continue as heretofore.

I again mentioned the matter of our possibly wishing to nominate an Officer for duty with the Regiment and you again told me it would be arranged.

I have taken the liberty of outlining these conversations, as nothing was put in writing on the matter.

An Army Council Instruction was, however, issued on the matter ~~last~~ ordering the treatment of men of the Royal Newfoundland to be undertaken in the same manner as that of Imperial Troops.

I regret having no copy of Army Council Instruction I am unable to supply reference number of this Instruction but I think it is 1656 of 24/8/16.

It has been found desirable that one of our Newfoundland Doctors should hold the post at Ayt of Medical Officer, Second Battalion, Royal Newfoundland Regiment.

I have been instructed by the Minister of Militia, Newfoundland, to nominate for this post.

There has been no fault whatever found with the present incumbent. Our only trouble has been the frequent changing of Officers as there are certain duties differing from those with other Regiments, which concern the repatriation of invalided soldiers.

I trust that the nomination now forwarded will meet with your approval.



As you may be aware, recently Capt. Knight was ordered by the War Office to return for service with the B.E.F., and being a R.A.M.C. Officer, it first appeared that he would have to go. Meanwhile the O.C. 2nd. Bn. came to Town, and advantage was taken of the Premier's presence in London, and although at first, representations failed, the order was eventually withdrawn and Capt. Knight remained.

The necessity of a permanent Newfoundland Medical Officer attached to the Depot, apart from one for this Office, is I believe thoroughly appreciated by all concerned. With regard to the latter appointment, it will doubtless have been observed that many boardings such as were temporarily carried out by Major Parsons and Capt. Knight, have perforce to be done by other means, thus producing methods and results at variance with the agreed line of procedure, especially with regard to page 5 of A.F.B.179.

In this connection, it is suggested that further reference may be made to Major Parsons, whom it is assumed will now be in St. Johns, and especially concerned in his official capacity with regard to awards of Pensions.






