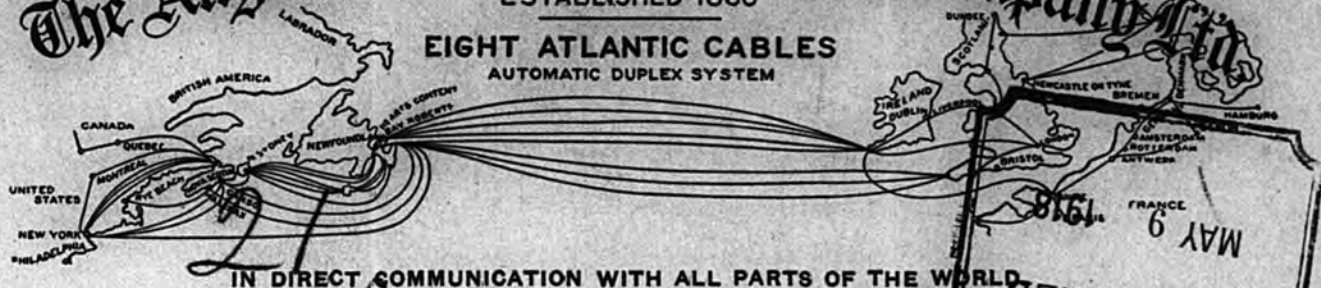

With further reference to your telegram of 14th January and my reply of 15th January, I am directed to inform you that the Record Office, London, took up the matter of the non-receipt of letters by #3923, Pte. W. Knott and the case was referred to the Officer Commanding the 2nd Battalion, with whom this soldier is serving. Officer Commanding 2nd Batt. states that there does not seem to be any room for any complaints. It is simply because this man is not receiving letters from home every week that he made the complaint. It is often a matter of five or six weeks before the Newfoundland mail arrives. He has recently been receiving his letters regularly and by the last mail received no less than twelve letters.

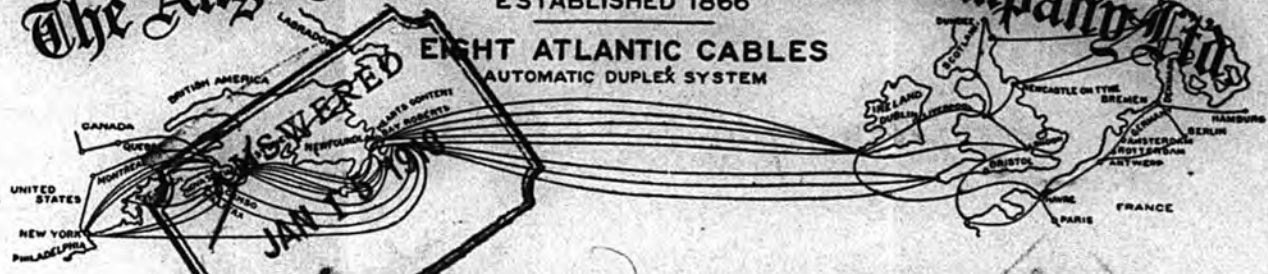


