## Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability

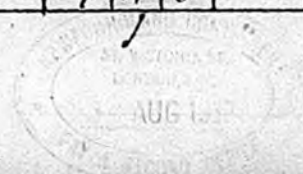

I am enclosing copies of correspondence between Pte. Peter Knox and this Dept., dealing with the matter of refund for passage money stated to have been paid by Mrs. Knox at Liverpool. The following information may be of use in your enquiries to the Steamship Co. in Liverpool.

Mrs. Knox states that she paid one sum of £3:0:0 and another of £3:8:9. I have seen her 3rd class steamer ticket, No. 7897, Deck "D", Room 54, Berth 1, for Mrs. Knox and infant. You will have the copy of your letter 11668/2/P&C of 2/11/17 addressed to Mrs. Knox, and your cable, No 277 of 3/11/17.

There is a contradiction in the attached correspondence, inasmuch as Mrs. Knox states that she paid for her passage, and your telegram to this Dept. states that her passage was paid to Halifax as customary. It is thought possible that she did not make application for free passage such as soldiers' wives are entitled to, in accordance with a resolution passed by the Executive Government on 20th Nov., to the effect that payment of passages of the wives of members of the 1st Nfld. Regiment and Royal Naval Reserve should be a charge against the Nfld. Government funds.

Please give this matter your attention.
