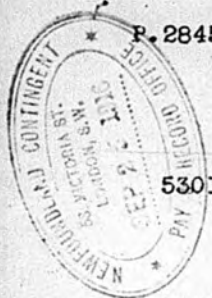

The above soldier was discharged from the Service as medically unfit on 19th March, his disability being Haematemesis. Pte. Lambert's medical history according to the reports is rather interesting. It is noted that he was admitted to the 50th C.C.S., suffering from influenza, on the 9th September 1916, he was invalided to England on 17th Sept., and admitted to the 3rd London General Hospital, on same date suffering from shell shock and was discharged on the 21st of the same month. The casualty report received at St. John's on the 20th Sept. stated that the disability was Nephritis, later at Ayr and on the 12th June, 1917, he was stated to be suffering from haematemesis. (Incidentally I may state that his last Board some few weeks ago passed him A.L., and about three days after the Board he had a hemorrhage and he was home for three days). I should be glad to know if you have any particulars concerning this soldier's medical history and also if his case as above stated tallies with your records.

The above soldier was discharged from the service as medically unfit on 19th March, his disability being Haematemesis. Pte. Lambert's medical history according to the reports is rather interesting. It is noted that he was admitted to the 50th C.S.S., suffering from influenza on the 9th September 1916 he was invalided to England on 17th Sept., and admitted to the 3rd London General Hospital, on same date suffering from shell shock and was discharged on the 21st of the same month. The casualty report received at St. John's on the 20th Sept. stated that the disability was Hepatitis, later at Ayr and on the 12th June, 1917, he was stated to be suffering from haematemesis. (Incidentally I may state that his last beard some few weeks ago passed him a.l., and about three days after the beard he had a hemorrhage and he was home for three days). I should be glad to know if you have any particulars concerning this soldier's medical history and also if his case as above stated tallies with your records.



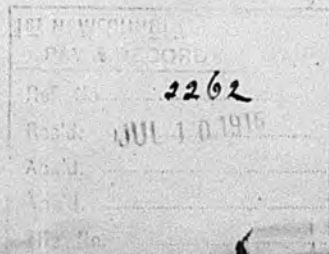

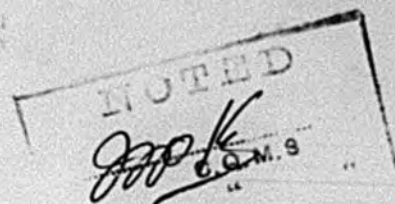

The above soldier was discharged from the Service as medically unfit on 19th March, his disability being Haematemesis. Pte. Lambert's medical history according to the reports is rather interesting. It is noted that he was admitted to the 50th C.C.S., suffering from influenza on the 9th September 1916, he was invalided to England on 17th Sept., and admitted to the 3rd London General Hospital, on same date suffering from shell shock and was discharged on the 21st of the same month. The casualty report received at St. John's on the 20th Sept. stated that the disability was Nephritis, later at Ayr and on the 12th June, 1917, he was stated to be suffering from haematemesis. (Incidentally I may state that his last Board some few weeks ago passed him A.I., and about three days after the Board he had a hemorrhage and he was home for three days). I should be glad to know if you have any particulars concerning this soldier's medical history and also if his case as above stated tallies with your records.

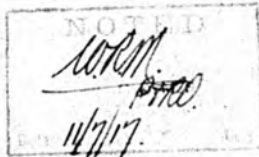

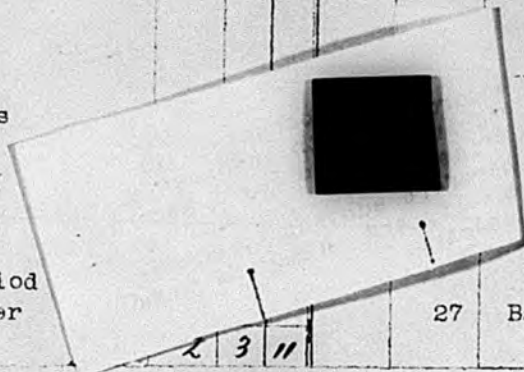

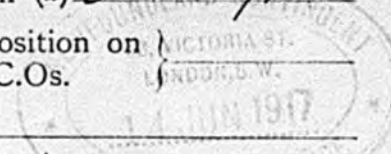
