I Am hereby requesting a copy of my discharge from the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, which I joined In March 1916 and went overseas as PRIVATE REGINALD JOSEPH LARNER NR- 2238, and returned as Sergeant , when the war was over.

I went to France in September of 1916 , I was sent back to Hospital 1917 from the Yser Canal Where our battalion was at that time, I then return again to France in the fall of that year, I am not sure of the date, and remained with my battalion, until we reached Hilden , beyond The Rhine, arriving home on the SS Corsican the first part of February when our Battalions First lot of men returned home.

MY hair is light, Eyes Blue, No scars, No Honors, (or Medals) height five feet ten half, weight 165 pounds, Hoping this can guide you in furthering same. I am very sorry to inconvenience you, but have searched for my Discharge every where and cannot locate it , Hoping you shall be able to forward same at a very early date.
