Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability.

INSTRUCTIONS—This form is to be completed in the case of every discharged soldier whose claim to pension, on account of disability, is to be submitted for the consideration of the Pensions and Disabilities Board.

This section should be completed in the Hospital at which a man is attending at the time of his examination by a Medical Board, or, if the man is not in Hospital, by the Medical Officer of the Unit or Command Depot. The Soldier should be given a full opportunity of examining it, as, if awarded a pension, his subsequent identification depends on his confirming this declaration. The "Rank," "Station" and "Date" should be in his own handwriting.

The form will then be attached to the Proceedings of the man's Medical Board and will be forwarded to the O. I. c. Records together with the remainder of the man's documents.

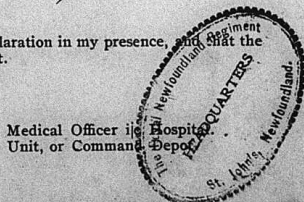

Reference the query in your communication of March 18th. with regard to medical examinations.

I am seeing the Standing Medical Board with regard to the specially mentioned examination, viz. 1498, Ex-Pte S. J. Learning, and shall report later on this particular case.

Every effort must be made, I quite agree with you, to have the soldiers them selves satisfied in as far as possible with their medical examinations and I shall endeavour to impress this upon the Standing Medical Board.

As regard the number of boards being held for discharge - You are evidently, Sir, under the impression that all men discharged go before the Standing Medical Board. This is not the case. A large number go only before a Travelling Medical Board when, if they have no complaint whatever, they go direct for discharge.

Instead of 30 per day the average has been since the "Corsican" arrived on February 7th., 1913, which gives an average per day, exclusive of Sundays, of 5.43 You will therefore see that there has been no neglect through rush of work.

The enclosed letter received from the Pension Commissioners was handed to me by ex-Pte. S.J. Learning, Pilot's Hill, City.

This soldier claims that he was not fairly treated or properly examined by the Standing Medical Board, in so far as outside of a question or two asked by Dr. Pele, Sr., as to whether he had any Dysentery now or not, no physical examination took place. In reply he said that he only had Dysentery slight, and the Doctor told him he was A1 or fit, but that he should not undertake any heavy work, and to look for a light job of some sort.

Now in view of the fact that this man was formerly a laborer on Job's Wharf, and having to return to such work to earn his livelihood, how is it possible that he can be considered fit, if he is unable to return to his former employment? A man's incapacity is measured by his value in the labour market, and this man, on the authority of the Medical Examiners, is not fully capable in this respect. Therefore, it must necessarily follow that he has some disability, and I strongly recommend that his case be brought before the Board again for consideration.

I think you will agree with me that it is most desirable that all the soldiers should be given every possible satisfaction in the case of their Medical Examinations, and the Doctors should be impressed with the fact that the most thorough investigation of the men's physical condition is carried out, otherwise considerable trouble is likely to ensue, and dissatisfaction follow.

I would like you to forward me a full report, as Director of Medical Services, as to whether the present establishment of Medical Boards is able to cope adequately with the present requirements. I understand that men are being discharged at the rate of thirty per day, and the point I wish to be satisfied upon is whether the Medical Board can efficiently carry out the examination at this rate.

Please let me have a report at your earliest convenience.
