With reference to your letter on reverse of form of claim for pension: The balance due to your late husband's estate on account of Pay and Allowances is £3:11:2: It is much regretted that through frequent change of the personnel of this office, the forwarding of this amount to the War Office for disposal as customary has been overlooked, but letter and cheque goes forward to-day. If you do not receive a communication from the War Office during the next week, you should write to The Secretary, War Office, Effects Branch (Men) Imperial Institute, South Kensington, London.

War Service Gratuity which is payable to demobilised soldiers is not admissible for dependants of soldiers who became deceased during their service with the Forces.

2. Copy of letter to Chief Staff Officer, Newfoundland Contingent, from Messrs. J. & A.B. Boyd, 79, High Street, Ayr, dated 21/11/19 Ref.JB/FM.

Mrs. Isabella Lee, 53, Dalblair Road, Ayr, has called for us upon your letter 12204/4/P&A, 13th November, 1919. She notes that if she does not receive communication from the War Office during this week, she is to write to the Secretary, War Office, Effects Branch (Men).

In regard to the last paragraph of your letter as to the War Service Gratuity, Mrs. Lee explains that her husband at the commencement of the War volunteered for a year, and when the year was up he went back to Newfoundland and was residing with his wife there, when he again volunteered and was killed on active service. She cannot understand why the War Service Gratuity is not payable to her, and she states to us that dependants of soldiers in the Canadian and British Army have been paid the War Service Gratuity which would have been paid to the soldiers had they survived and been demobilised, and she is at a loss to know why the usual gratuity is not payable to her.

We shall be obliged if you will explain. We should explain that the deceased left a widow and one son, an infant.

As you are probably aware War Service Gratuity of this Contingent is issuable at rates under Regulations similar to the O.M.F.C. In order to be consistent with your rulings, the following case is submitted for an expression of opinion as to whether under circumstances War Service Gratuity should be paid to the deceased soldier's estate, in respect of the first period of his service or both.

No.134 Pte Albert Lee enlisted at St. John's, Newfoundland, 17/2/15, for the duration of War but not exceeding 1 year. He served in Gallipoli 1/12/1915 to January 8th 1916 was discharged at his own request after having served 1 year 153 days.

He re-enlisted 9/11/16 and served for one year, 340 days when he was killed on Active Service in Belgium 14/10/18.

Under C.R.O.5308, Para. 7 the Gratuity is not payable to the estate of an Officer or man who dies in the Service (Section 12) Note (a) of your rulings would appear to indicate that Gratuity is payable in respect of the soldiers first enlistment and if this is so presumably the amount due should be credited to his estate.

An early reply to the foregoing will be much appreciated.

5. Copy of letter to Chief Staff Officer, Newfoundland Contingent, from O.M.F.C. Pay Officer, 7 Millbank, London, S.W.1. dated 2/12/19
-

With reference to your 12334/2/P&A of the 25th ultimo, the question raised therein has been carefully considered, and it appears that in the case of a Canadian Soldier, the point of issue would be covered by the following Ruling of our Pay and Allowance Board.

"Death of Officer
or man while in
the service.

(36) The Gratuity is not payable to the next-of-kin or beneficiary in receipt of the Separation Allowance in respect of an Officer, Warrant Officer or man who dies while in the service, unless such Officer, Warrant Officer or man had enlisted twice and qualified for War Service Gratuity by virtue of his first enlistment. In the latter case Gratuity would be payable to the beneficiary who was in receipt of Separation Allowance at the date of his first discharge, and would be payable on the basis of that period of service only.

It is emphasised that Gratuity in respect of the first enlistment would only be payable to a dependent who was in receipt of Separation Allowance at the time of the soldier's discharge.

In the particular case now under review, the whole question resolves itself whether Pte Lee did actually leave such dependant. No Gratuity whatever would, of course, be payable in respect of his second enlistment. His dependent, if any, would be eligible for pension on account of the soldier's death on active service.



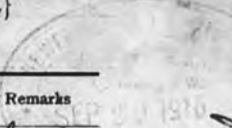
