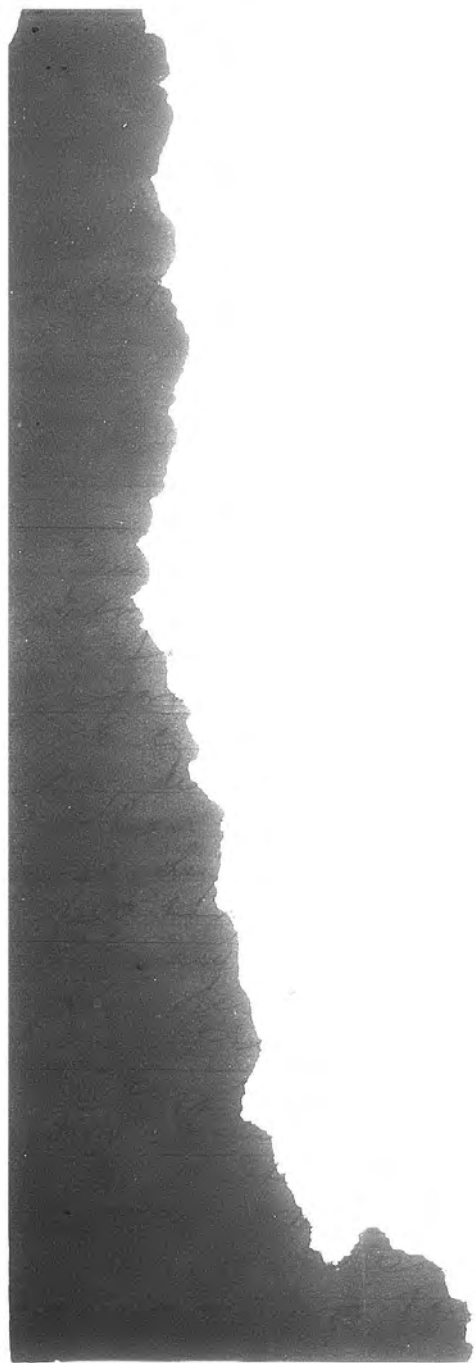

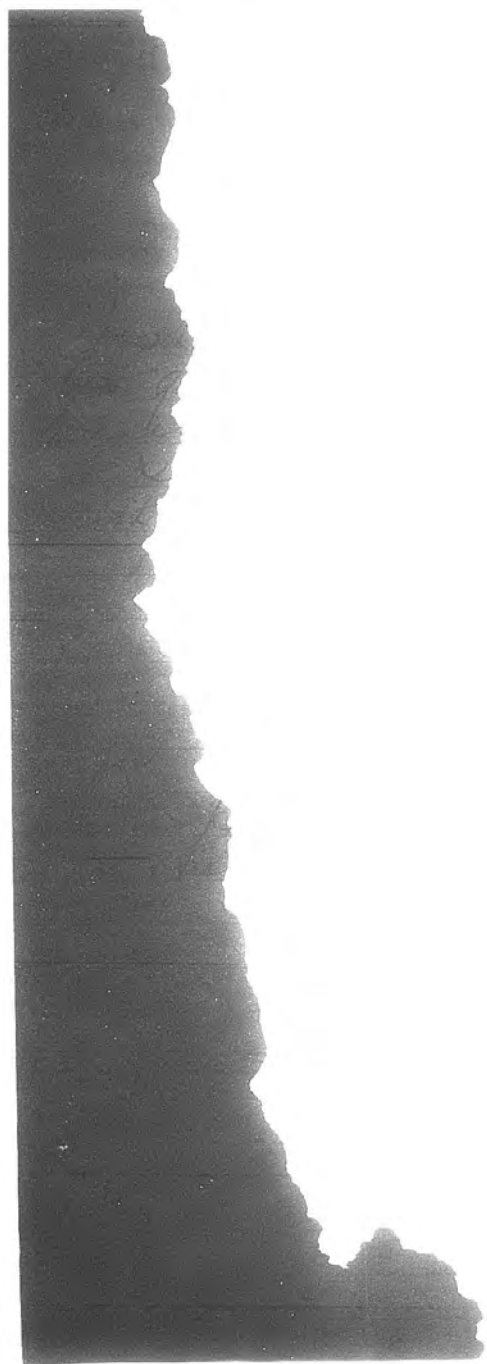

Dear Lemee:-

I am in receipt of your letter of Oct. 27th, and in accordance with your request, have forwarded by registered mail your Newfoundland Commission, which I trust, will arrive safely.

You seem to have had an exciting time in crossing, and were lucky in avoiding the fate of other ships, particularly seeing that you were chased and fired at on three days in succession. That particular form of excitement is finished with for the present, and, I suppose, with it your duties in the Flying Service will be directed to other channels. I remember you telling me when you were out here that your squadron was working on coast defence duties, in connection with the petrol service.

I expect you have seen in the English papers that our boys formed part of a composite Battalion that escorted the King of the Belgians into Brussels; the Times and other papers crack us up a bit about it, and I suppose it will mean more Belgian decorations for some of our Officers.

I trust you are keeping well, and being able to exist without putting your machine and pilot into the sea, as you did just before you came out.

I must to inform you that I had quite an exciting voyage crossing that is we were fired on three days in succession when some few hundred miles off the Coast.

I was jolly glad to get my foot on the land again after the narrow escape and ship had from being sunk by U. Boats.

Since I arrived back I have had  
 a medical Board which I also found  
 to be in quite Physical Condition  
 as well for flying.

I would like to give you full details  
 of how things are being carried out  
 here just now, but you quite under-  
 stand the circumstances that prevent  
 allow me to do as best I can.

I thank you for your kindness  
 in informing me of the above.

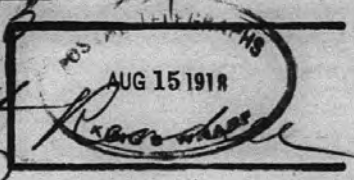

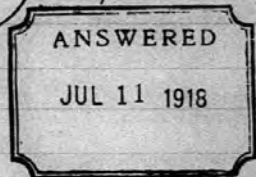

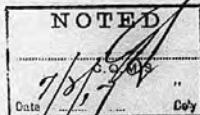

FLYING PAY.

With reference to your letter 1/1/18 (56): Your reference to Flying Pay is not clearly understood but it is presumed that you have confused the Imperial rates of pay with those in force in this Contingent. It is now given for your information that a Newfoundland Officer attached to the Royal Flying Corps is entitled to receive 50 cents per day from the date so attached until such time as he qualifies as a Flying Officer (Pilot or Observer) or is returned to his Unit. From the date of qualification he is entitled to receive a consolidated rate of pay, \$6.00 per day, less the cost of rations issued ex. Imperial Stocks (present value 1s. 9d). You have been credited with the former rate (50 cents per day) from 9/12/17, that being the date on which it is understood you were attached to the R. F. C.

With reference to exchange of cheque: As a general rule this is not permitted, Lieut. Marshall however informs me that he received a cheque £3.0.0. from you privately, which he cashed at the Bank of Montreal and forwarded the proceeds to you on the 29/12/17 by registered post, a receipt for which he holds. It would be much more convenient if your cheques were forwarded direct to the Bank of Montreal to be cashed. It is suggested that you may be able to arrange to open an account with the Local Bank and transfer your pay from the Bank of Montreal at the end of each period. This would obviate the necessity

Dear Sir.

I regret to inform you that I have met with a flying accident on the North Sea on April 26. 4. 18.

I am now I cannot give you full details of the accident but I will explain briefly what happened.

We left our Anchorage at 0. 18. 00. 6 pm for the northern patrol and proceeded some 50 miles N. when roughly 3 miles N.E. of the Coast we spotted something which appeared to be a hostile Submarine we dived on it and circled over same for some time finding no result we decided to come home

It was now 7 pm we turned about with a 30 miles  
 N.E. wind behind us when a few miles S. of X Island  
 our Engine began to peter out we were now  
 2000 feet and about 3 miles over the Sea. Seeing  
 our position we tried to make for land but  
 our luck was against us we got within 3/4  
 miles from the Shore the Engine stopped  
 Suddenly the machine nose dived into the  
 Sea.

Of course when the machine struck the  
 water was thrown in air I turned about  
 3 Saucer sauto before I struck the water  
 I immediately sank to Bottom came  
 to the surface and sank again the second  
 time, coming to the surface again I saw  
 the machine some distance ahead of  
 me headed towards sea.

I then saw my Pilot clinging on to  
 the wreckage he was apparently covered  
 in blood. Seeing his predicament I  
 swam out to him, I found him unconscious  
 now came my second task to reach  
 the shore with him.

strength being very much water logged with  
 as my flying kit on to stick out for  
 the land which I successfully reached  
 supporting the unconscious Officer.  
 After I reached the land I totally  
 collapsed and never remembered anything  
 until the following morning when I awoke

WAR SERVICE GRATUITY

With reference to your letter received //4/19 (2660): The gratuity payable to an officer of this contingent on retirement from the service as the result of demobilization is assessed at the rate of pay he was receiving at the date of retirement.

In the case of a Newfoundland Officer seconded for duty with the R.A.F., the gratuity will be assessed at the regimental rates of pay in the rank that he was holding at the date of his retirement.

An officer with three years service or over receives a gratuity of 183 days Pay & Field Allowance, i.e. in the case of a Lieutenant £3.00 per day.

The gratuity is not issuable until the officer is retired when it is paid as follows: 31 days Pay and Field Allowance on the date of retirement and the balance at intervals of 30 and 31 days alternately until the full amount is paid.

Gratuity is payable to Officers demobilized in the United Kingdom or Newfoundland.


