

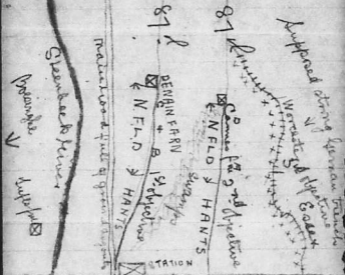

Dear Hugh: -

Received your letter of
the 22nd yesterday. Ralph came up from
Bramshott to see me yesterday afternoon.
It is just nine years since I saw him
last. He is leaving for Canada Monday on
a three months furlough.

With regard to our share in the scrap I will
detail as closely as possible.

The regiment left its advanced camps for the
line Sunday (23rd) afternoon about 5 PM.

Arrived at the support trenches about 8 PM. These
trenches were formerly the German second line
of defence. They are to left of where we held the
line, when we were in before.

F. C. & D Companies were ahead of us, in front
 and slightly left and right. We had a half ditch
 trench where my platoon was posted. Right behind
 our company were seven rows of field
 artillery 18 ^{lb} pounders wheel to wheel. Had a good
 many shells come over behind us, but none
 fell into our trench. Had two wounded from
 Shrapnel. Left this ^{trench} Tuesday evening at 9 P.M. for
 the front line. Arrived at Tuffe's area, which is
 about one hundred yards south of the river
 Cherwell and close to the Broad Gange
 railroad some time later and I hit down the side
 of a shell hole before we got to the farm. and went to
 my neck in water & mud. It was a very
 chilly bath to have for a start.
 8 Platoon from B. Coy & 9 Platoon of C. Coy

was told off to cross the Scharbeck and take over some advanced post, which the Tankilling Furriers had dug the night previous close to the German lines.

Our platoon under Lieut Fred Rendell had two large shell holes joined together. Fritz had a line running crescent shape about thirty yds ahead of us. About twenty yds to our right and in line was a strong concrete block house, directly behind was another of the same sort full of German snipers. As you can see we had to keep on the alert. Got quite a few of them about two hours after we got there. Fritz couldn't make out who was firing as we were behind his block houses. I suspect he never dreamed of any of our troops.

being so handy. Day low all that day, which was wednesday but kept a very strict watch with the periscope. One young sniper ran right by the place and seen us. He dropped his rifle. up went his hands and ^{he} hollered out in English I surrender. We didnt want prisoner out here, so we gave him a new found land twist and he went under to bail no more. Fred and his men in the other shell got quite a few later on in the day including a couple of officers. The instructions told us to keep very quiet as it was a very dangerous post. We couldnt resist the temptation to swat the German sniper though.

It rained like the dickens at intervals while we were in the shell holes. you

can imagine how we felt. I think a lot of our chaps were new to the game, but they turned out to be brinks. I went in last time as Platoon Sergh

We left the strong point about three o'clock, which was an hour before our barrage was to open and joined up with the rest of the Battalion. B+C went over in the 1st wave. Hants on our right and the K.O.S.B of the 87th Brigade on our left. The 87th connected up with the French division on the left. The Hants of our Brigade connected up with the 20th Division "Langemarck" was about 200 yds to our right. That is, the Hants right. A Battalion has to cover ^{lateral} 400 yds of ground and keep connected up at both flanks. Otherwise something will happen once in a while, as it did in April

when we went over on the 14th. The barrage never extended and closed up to us.

Zero was set for 4 am. when we had to jump out and get as close to the barrage as possible. Had no jumping out trench this time, so the 1st wave was lined up on the north side of the stream. The other waves on the south side of the river.

By having our outposts out ~~we~~ were able to keep off snipers and observers and accomplish what we did in having all the platoons laid off in good order.

At zero the barrage commenced about 200 yds ahead of us. we got as close as possible and started clearing it. The Germans trying to get back clear of the barrage.

The barrage stopped for 5 mts at the 200 yd limit. Then crept on for another 100 yds. 5 mts was the time allowed for covering the 100 yds. So you see we had plenty of time to get around shell holes and mop up what was left in the battered dug outs. We got quite a few shot ran back and got into dug outs where they thought they were safe. Our company took no prisoners though, as some of the German wounded kept sniping us. I accounted for a few myself, just to even up scores. Took our objective early after 17 mts going. It was only about 450 yds. but the going was awful. You were up to your knees in some places. Our platoon was about

half dug in and connected up when I got
 two bullets through the thigh from a ^{wounded} German
 who we didn't finish off. They bandaged
 me up with the usual field bandage and
 I started off back. Got back a very short
 distance when I had to give in
 and wait for a stretcher.

They operated on me right away when
 I arrived at the C.C.S. as my wound looked
 pretty serious. The bullet stripped my
 water works by a hair. One of the bullets went
 in my right thigh and came out at the
 chick of the other side. Very lucky indeed
 for me. I don't know of anything else
 that you might want to know

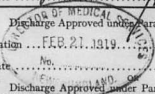



About 8.15 a.m. the enemy attacked from the right and obtained a footing in the trench and gained the head of the communication trench. Bombs were being taken from Pte Lewis' post and he knew the stock was running short. Without any orders he jumped over the parapets and ran back across the open to Pals trench and obtained 2 boxes of bombs from the Company in support. He carried them over the open and was returning for more when he was stopped by an Officer, as the enemy had been driven out. This was done under very heavy shell fire and in a place where the snipers were notoriously active."
