I forward for your perusal a letter which I have recently received, and which tells its own story. Loder has, I gather volunteered; but should he be sent in the face of what his father states? Perhaps however the lad is of age and would prefer going to staying. From the father's point of view he is badly needed at home. I should be obliged if you would have enquiry made into the case.

My Lord,

I am in receipt of your letter of 27th June, covering letter from Mr. Levi Loder, of Great Harbour Deep, dated June 20th, concerning his son, #5620 Pte. Frederick Loder. On attestation, this man gave his age as 24 years; his enlistment was voluntarily, and it is regretted that discharge of a soldier can take place only for military reasons. It is presumed that Loder will recognise his responsibility, and continue to support those dependent on him, by making an Allotment.

I should be glad if you will point out to Mr. Loder that when a man has been attested, exemption cannot be claimed, and as previously stated, his discharge can only take place for military reasons; that he is medically unfit, under age, or not likely to make an efficient soldier.

We are returning Mr. Loder's letter herewith, as requested.

My Lord,

Our Catechist, (Mr. Morgan) has told me to write you in time of trouble, and I don't know who else to turn to who can plead my cause better than the Shepherd of the Sheep.

My son Frederick Loder has volunteered for Active Service, and he has been accepted. I do not know what I am going to do if he goes and leaves me. I am a cripple, I have got only one hand, and I got a son who has been walking with crutches from child-birth, and I also got a wife and two daughters entirely dependent on Fred. If there is any cause for exemption I can justly claim it for my son.

My Lord, use your influence with the Military Authorities to reconsider my son's case and grant him a little longer with me. I will gladly let him go with the last class when I know that my Country will need him greatly, but I believe that although he is needed at the front, I think he is needed far more at home.
