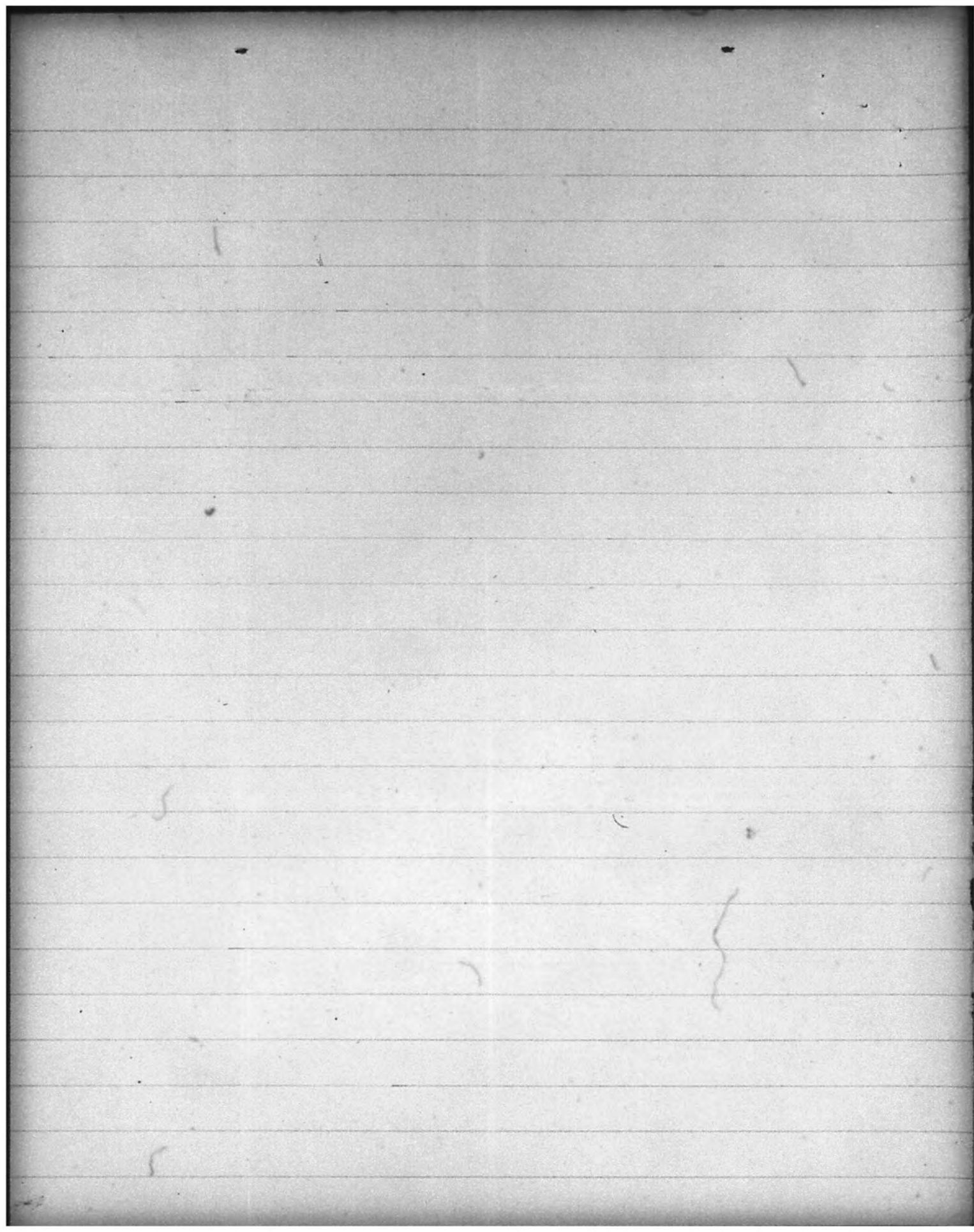

Dear Sir,-

I wish to call your attention to the case of my son Pte. Nathaniel G. Lodge (no 2810) who is now in the Hospital at Wandsworth suffering from myalgia.

He was wounded in the leg in the great battle on the 14 of April; and after spending some time in hospital in England and at Ayr, he went back to France; but as his leg was weak and gave him trouble he was sent back to the base hospital for a time and has lately been sent to Wandsworth.

He wrote me from France that he could scarcely walk and was not fit for active service. He

expressed his regret and disappointment in not getting to the front again. If he is unfit for active service, I shall be glad if you will get for him his discharge at an early date, as I need him at home and he can better serve his King and Country here than he can where he is in his present condition.

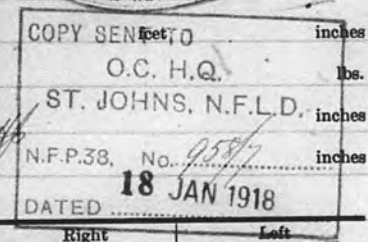

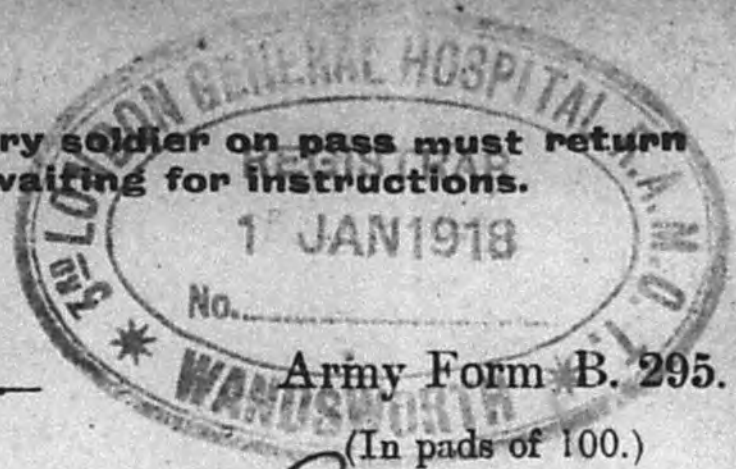

I wish to call your attention to the case of my son, Pte. Nathaniel G. Lodge, No. 2810, who is now in the hospital at Wandsworth suffering from myalgia.

He was wounded in the leg in the great battle on the 14th of April; and after spending some time in hospital in England and at Ayr, he went back to France; but as his leg was weak and gave him trouble, he was sent back to the base hospital for a time and has lately been sent to Wandsworth.

He wrote me from France that he could scarcely walk and was not fit for active service. He expressed his regret and disappointment in not getting to the front again. If he is unfit for active service, I shall be glad if you will get for him his discharge at an early date, as I need him at home and he can better serve his king and country here than he can where he is in his present condition.

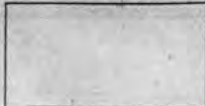

With reference to your letter of 8th January requesting certain information relative to the above mentioned men, I beg to inform you in reply thereto that:

No. 165 Private Samuel Lodge enlisted in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment on Sept. 2nd. 1914: and died of wounds on Gallipoli Oct. 1st 1915. No. 2810 Pte. Nathaniel Lodge enlisted on 29th May 1916. He was Discharged on April 19th, 1918 as permanently unfit. He received a pension of \$5.00 per month from Jan. 1920, previous to that date it was \$10.00 per month, it being lessened owing to his disability being decreased. His pension is forwarded to Bell Island, Newfoundland where he is at present residing. Forwarded herewith is Report of Medical Board held on his discharge.

No allowance in respect of either son has been paid to Mrs. Lodge.
