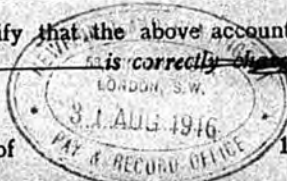

I have to acknowledge receipt of your communication of Oct. 12th asking for information concerning the above mentioned case.

Mrs. Lodge's application form shows that " She is 68 years of age, and is a Widow. Her family are as follows :- Tobias, age 42, married. Heber age 36, married, Captain on a Foreign Vessel. James age 32, single. Nathaniel age 29, single. Also there are three daughters married.

The War Pension's Act states that a "Dependent " means the parent, grandparent, or great grandparent of a member of the forces or the person who has been for a reasonable time in the place of a parent with respect to a member of the forces, who, at the time of the death of the member of the forces and for a reasonable time previously thereto, had not sufficient earnings or income to provide for his maintenance, and who during such time was maintained wholly, or to a material extent by such member of the forces. Dependents in receipt of earnings or income, equal to \$480, per year shall be deemed to have sufficient income for their maintenance.

As Mrs Lodge had two unmarried sons it could not be considered that she was solely or mainly dependent upon her deceased son and an award could not be made. It is noted that these two sons have since married and we cannot take over the responsibility for the maintenance of their mother.

Attached herewith is Mr. Lodge's letter to the prime Minister.
