A serious wound means that the injury is a bad one, but does not mean that the man's condition is dangerous, so I think you need not worry concerning your son.



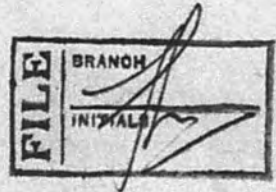
