Opinion of the Medical Board.

NOTES.—(i.) MY BRIEF EXPERIENCE AS A PRISONER OF WAR
IN GERMANY.

I was wounded on April 14th. on the Arras front in front of the village Monchy about 10.45 a.m. soon after the Germans surrounded us and took us all prisoners, two came to me and with their help I walked to a little hut behind their lines where I was palced on a rough stretcher and brought to their advance dressing station, where I lay outside the hut till about six o'clock, then they took me inside and robbed me of every personal thing I had, but did not take my letter or photos, what they took they wanted for souvenirs. I was then placed in the rear of this hut on a stretcher on the floor, which was covered with straw. In reply to your letter of June 3rd I beg to state that you were awarded a pension of 40% for your disability on re-examination, and would call your attention to the fact that according to the regulations, or disability table, a man who has lost a hand at the wrist is only receiving 50% pensionable disability

In your case, however, you have your hand which though somewhat deformed and wasted, with no movement at the wrist, yet you have some slight movement in the thumb and fingers, which to some extent is useful to you, and better than being without a hand

I note in your letter that you stated previous to your enlistment you had a trade as a book-binder which you are now unable to continue, but I believe that you are taking a course under the Civil Re-Establishment Committee which is given with the object of helping a man who has been disabled in such a way, that he can not carry on his former work, and for this reason you have been granted a course so that you may be capable of taking up some occupation which will be beneficial to you in your future career

It is regretted very much that no further increase in your pension can be given as you will notice by the above that you have been awarded a full disability according to the regulations now standing, and as recommended by the Standing Medical Board. In view of this I am afraid that nothing further can be done

In the absence of the Secretary I beg to ask of you information regarding my pension

The result of my first Board was 100% and message treatment, reboarded on April 21st and yesterday received a letter to the effect that I am to receive \$21.25 per month, 40% for six months, and then to submit myself for reexamination to determine the continuance or otherwise of my pension.

Why is my disability reduced to less than one half of the result of my previous board and no treatment? About nine months ago Dr. Knight told me he believed that it was possible for me to get use in my hand, anyway to get my fingers straightened

I have no use whatever in my left hand, it is very inconvenient in the matter of dressing and the handling of utensils at meal times

I am not asking the Pension Board to support me, but I only want justice done to me. Previous to my enlistment I had a trade (Bookbinder) which required the use of both hands. Upon my return from overseas, to resume my trade was impossible, and I was taken on the Militia Staff as an accountant, and later transferred to the Pensions Dept.. When demobilised I naturally expected to hold on this position but was passed over for an A 1 man, the Secretary giving his reason my disability. If such is the case, do you not think my disability should be rated at more than 40%

MY BRIEF EXPERIENCE AS A PRISONER OF WAR IN GERMANY.

*Original in
hands of [unclear]*

I was wounded on April 14th. on the Arras front in front of the village Monchy about 10.45 a.m. soon after the Germans surrounded us and took us all prisoners, two came to me and with their help I walked to a little hut behind their lines where I was placed on a rough stretcher and brought to their advance dressing station, where I lay outside the hut till about six o'clock, then they took me inside and robbed me of every personal thing I had, but did not take my letters or photos, what they took they wanted for souvenirs. I was then placed in the rear of this hut on a stretcher on the floor, which was covered with straw. About nine that night I was roused up and placed in a hay cart with seven more men on some straw and drove to Douai Hospital. On the way we stopped at the German H.Q.s. where my wounds were dressed, and I was placed in a motor ambulance and continued the journey to the hospital; about four o'clock in the morning I arrived there. At eight, I got my breakfast which consisted of bread and coffee. The conditions of this hospital were awful; the bed I lay in had no sheets, but just a mattress, pillow and blanket, and I lay there naked with just this blanket over me.

I was there three days and four nights, then I was sent to Barbara hospital in Hamborn a/Rhein. I was placed on board a Red Cross train, but the carriage I was in was a ^{class} fourth one; they placed me on a mattress on one of the seats, another chap on the other seat and another on the floor, all that night on train. About mid-day the next day I changed trains and this one was a Red Cross train everything fitted up fine. On this train I received a bowl of soup and some bread. The next day about 1.30 I arrived at Hamborn, brought to the hospital on a stretcher about fifty yards, placed in a comfortable bed, given some coffee and bread to eat.

The food at this hospital was as good as might be expected. The Menu for the day would be, 8 o'clock, coffee and bread, 11 soup (sometimes potatoes

and sauerkraut or cabbage) with a little bit of meat; 2.50, coffee, 6 soup. The coffee was unweetened as usual the bread brown and the soups consisted of barley, oats, meal, peas and horse beans, etc.

No amusement of any kind or exercise for us prisoners, at the hospital, but I volunteered to go to the Post Office after our parcels, and judging from the appearance of the people, and the condition of that particular town in tearing down and disfiguring military posters, the German people don't seem as patriotic as at first.

I was in this hospital till Dec. 4/17, then I was sent to Dulmen, there from the fourth till mid-day on the eighth. While there I went before the doctor who made out my papers for Konstanz for me to be interned in Switzerland, but instead of going there, I was sent to Mannheim, where I went before the Swiss Commission who passed me for England.

The sanitary arrangements of this camp were in an awful condition, the latrines were all open to the cold and snow and the huts both inside and out are very dirty; the food was terrible and I didn't receive any parcels there owing to getting shifted from one place to the other.

Left there the 28th. of Dec. for "Aachen". The first train I got on board had one window broken and it was a beastly cold night. The next morning we changed trains (this one was better) and arrived at our destination none the worse for our journey but full of hopes of getting to Blighty soon.

I was treated extra good at "Aachen", I suppose it was to give a good impression to take home. On the 1st. Jan. I left there and was soon on my journey across the border, but couldn't believe I was a free man. The Holland people ~~was~~ treated us very good. I received a most delightful reception here in Nottingham and words can't express how delighted I am to be back in dear old Blighty once again.

In reply to your letter of July 20th concerning the case of Mr. A.W. Loveys of 50 Gilbert Street, I would state that I have discussed his case with the Board of Pension Commissioners (J.A. Clift, Esq., pro Chairman, Capt. J.B. O'Rielly, Act. Secretary), and I might say that Loveys was at one time employed in the Pay Office of this Department, and when his services were terminated in that office, he was lent temporarily to the Pensions Board. Later when demobilisation was being carried out, the Board of Pension Commissioners stated that they could dispense with his services and he could be demobilized, and that they were employing Sergt. Ronald Martin. Martin had previously been employed in the London Pay & Record Office, and was in charge of the pension work in that office: for that reason, and because of his efficiency as an accountant, he was employed with the sanction of the Government.
