

Dear Madam,

It was with the greatest regret that the Government received a message from the Record Office, London, reporting that your husband, Private Frederick W. Lucas, had died at the 24th Casualty Clearing Station, France, on the 28th January, as a result of gunshot wounds in the thigh and wrist.

Permit me to express to you on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, sincere sympathy in your time of sorrow. But though we feel the parting and though the heart is heavy with its loss, yet it is a glorious thing to think that your gallant husband early responded to the call of duty and made his stand for the establishment of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty upon the earth. We are all proud of our brave and noble men but no less do we esteem the unselfish wives who so willingly gave their husbands when the call of duty came. Though your husband has laid down his earthly weapons he wears the soldier's Crown of Victory and his name is inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and will be held in fragrant memory by all his fellowcountrymen. When the end of this war comes and an honourable and abiding Peace will have been established, it will be your proud thought that your dear husband did to the utmost of his ability to bring about such result.

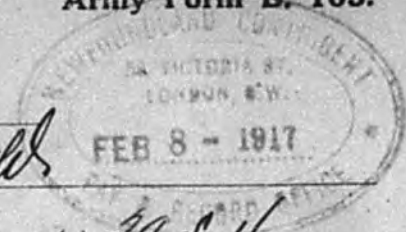
