Referring to previous correspondence and to the decision of the Board that Mrs. Lukins cannot be considered to have been dependent upon her husband as she, so far as the Boards' information went, had decided of her own accord to live apart from her husband thereby forfeiting all claim upon him for her support. I beg to say that I advised my client of this decision and enclose herewith her statement of the true facts of the case which do not correspond with the information apparently received by the Board. My client also states that she is quite willing if required to verify the enclosed statement on oath. In view of the obvious error as to her reasons for leaving her husband which was made when her case was being considered she requests that it receive further consideration in the light of the enclosed statement.

With regard to the claim for separation allowance if it is understood that I left my husband of my own accord it is incorrect. I married Private George Lukins in May 1913 in the R.C. Cathedral but he belonged to the Church of England. I lived happy with him until November of the same year and then he wanted me to go to his Church and I would not go and then he told me in the presence of his mother that he would give me a hard time all my life with him and he gave me a hard time until about the 23rd of February 1914 when he came home intoxicated and wanted the baby from me and told me if I wouldn't give him the baby he would kill me. His sister was in the house at the time it happened and she went for her father so he came and told me to leave him and go at his house and he would support me and he said he wouldn't allow George in his house. I stayed there two nights. My husband came to his father's home next day intoxicated again and they let him stay there. He was just as bad there, so I told his mother that I couldn't live like that and that I was going to my sister's. I went there next day. They did not have much room for me as they had a family of their own, but they did their best for me thinking that he would get better and take me and the baby home. My brother-in-law belongs to the Church of England himself and told me he would sooner have me there than to suffer with him and he said it was not religion that was wrong with him it was only that he was tired of keeping house. Then he went to the icefields in March 1914 and left me still without money and I had to go to work as a tailoress and he locked up the house that we lived in and gave his father the key. I sent

for it to get the cot for my baby who was sick and his mother told me his father had it, His father sent the cot and while my husband was at the ice his father went in and took some of the furniture out of the house so I had no home to go back to. When he came from the ice he sent and asked me if I needed money. I told him yes and he sent me five dollars. Then he went to work and gave me three dollars and he told me he would do no more for me unless I would go to his church and if so he would take a home for me. Then he went to Halifax and about the time war broke out he came home and enlisted so I went to Major Franklin and stated my case to him and he told me he would not go over-seas till he would leave me his allotment. He also told me that he would let me know when he would be sworn in but he went away without doing so. Then I went to Mr. Timewell and he told me they were sworn in on the ship going over. Then Dr. Macpherson wrote to England about my husband but it was his brother Private Jack Lukins that was asked about it.

There was never any deed of Separation between my husband and myself and I never gave up my claim upon him for my support and my baby's, although all I received from him from February 1914 was \$8.00 mentioned above.

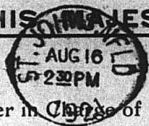

For some time past the Imperial Government have been making enquiries in relation to those men of the First Newfoundland Regiment who have been reported missing since the action of the 1st July. I very much regret to state, however, that from the correspondence which has taken place, a copy of which I enclose, it is evident that none of them are Prisoners of War in Germany, and the authorities are, therefore, reluctantly forced to the conclusion that all these gallant men, whose names are given in the enclosed list, and one of whom was very dear to you, were killed in that fateful action on the 1st of July.

I desire to express to you on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy in this time of sorrow. We feel the loss of our loved ones, but it will, no doubt, be some consolation to you to think that he, for whom you now mourn, willingly answered the call of King and Country, did his part nobly, and fell, facing the foe, in defence of the principles of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty. Though he has laid down the earthly weapons of warfare, he now wears the Soldier's Crown of Victory, and his name will be inscribed upon the Glorious Roll of Honor, and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen. When the victory is won, and Peace again reigns upon the earth, it will be a comforting thought to you that in this glorious achievement he bore no small part.

I trust that you may have the Grace and consolation of the Great Father of us all at this time.
