



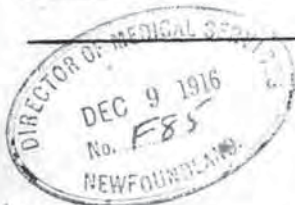

SUBSISTENCE ALLOWANCE AT ST. JOHN'S.

The following is an extract of a reply from the Deputy Paymaster at Headquarters, dated 22/9/16, in reply to mine dated 19/8/16:-

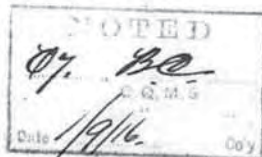


