In reply to your letter of the 17th inst: I beg to inform you that after enquiries had been made in Germany and elsewhere, the authorities in Newfoundland recently declared the men of this Contingent who were missing since 1st July to be presumed dead. This office, however, which deals with the next-of-kin in Great Britain, was not informed of the decision of the Newfoundland authorities. In the ordinary course of events, 30 weeks should elapse before a missing man is reported presumed dead, and you would have been notified by this office after the lapse of that time.

With regard to allotment, in conformity with the custom of this Contingent, allotment ceases from the date the soldier is reported missing, unless the allottee can prove satisfactorily that he or she is a dependant relative, when it may be continued for a further period.


