Madam,-

With further reference to my letter 10269/1, 5/10/17, and your reply 7/10/17: The only payments you should have received are those made to you by this office in respect of allotment made in your favour by Pte. Macklin, which is deducted from his pay. Unfortunately payments have also been made in respect of the same from Newfoundland.

No allowances for dependents of Soldiers have yet been granted by the Newfoundland Government and it would therefore appear that you were under a misapprehension as to the payment made in error by Headquarters in Newfoundland, who have now asked this office to adjust these overpayments.

It is therefore regretted that unless you are in a position to refund the whole amount in one sum the following alternatives are suggested,-

(1) Stop payment of allotment until overpaid amount £6.5.4 is cleared, or

(2) Reduce allotment to one half, that is you would receive £1. 8. 9. every four weeks instead of £2. 17. 6 until overpayment is cleared.

It is desired that as little inconvenience to you as possible may be caused in correcting this unfortunate error, so perhaps you will be good enough to advise which method of recovery you would wish this office to follow.

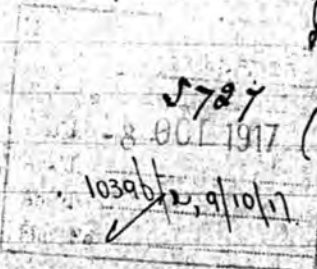




