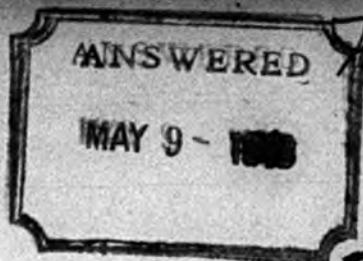

One parcel posted at Marquise October 20th (1914) containing one pound Tobaccos and nine packages cigarettes and another parcel posted at Placentia Nov 27th 1914 containing one cake. two pairs Socks. two lbs Tobaccos ten packages cigarettes. Parcels were packed according to instructions issued by the department of Militia. both were carefully packed and sewed in canvas and complied in every way with the regulations regarding the sending of parcels. Neither one of these parcels has reached their destination. Although parcels posted two days later reached their destination safely I would be much obliged if you would make enquiries to ascertain what became of them.

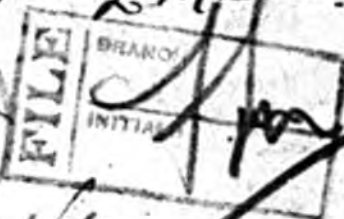

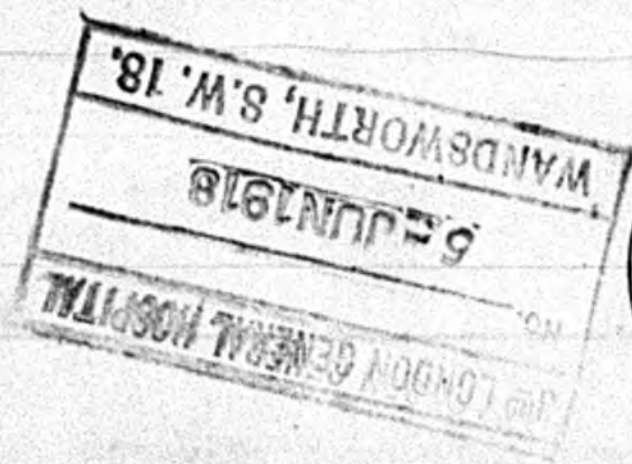
