

Sir,

I am at present favoured with a call from the Rev. G. H. Maidment of Newfoundland, who has recently arrived here.

Mr. Maidment informs me that during a conversation with you, you expressed a desire to be provided with certain information with regard to the disposition of the Newfoundland troops.

The 1st Battn. is serving with the B. E. F., the 2nd (Reserve) Battn. is at present stationed at Barry, Forfarshire, whilst the nucleus of the new Forestry Corps is at Dunkeld, the latter only comprising about 100 men at present.

As you may be aware the Newfoundland Regiment embraces four or five denominations; also it may be mentioned that the extent of the Contingent generally does not justify the existence of its own Chaplains' Department, but of course it would be much appreciated by those concerned if a Newfoundland clerical gentleman could be in touch with either the active Battn. at the Front or the Reserve one in this Country, and so far as this office is concerned, any arrangement that you may find it possible to make with regard to the foregoing is left in your good hands.


