The awful calamity which overtook the "S.S. Florizel" and which shocked not alone this whole community, but the entire country, had a special message of grief for you and your family in the loss of your noble son, his wife and child. I can assure you that my heartfelt sympathy, as well as that of the Dept. of Militia, and the Officers and men of The Royal Newfoundland Regiment goes out to you in this, your great bereavement.

Your son has nobly done his part in facing the foe and fighting for the principles of truth and righteousness; and after being wounded and obtaining an honourable discharge from his regiment, it is sad, indeed, that his life should be so suddenly terminated upon his stepping ^{forth} into the world to make a living for himself and those dependent upon him.

I trust that in this, your sad bereavement you will obtain this satisfaction: that in the hour of his country's need, he faithfully did his duty; and in the closing moments of his life, he died battling for those near and dear to him, and who were depending on him for

succour. His name will remain on the scroll of honour of this country, and will live long after present time and events are forgotten.

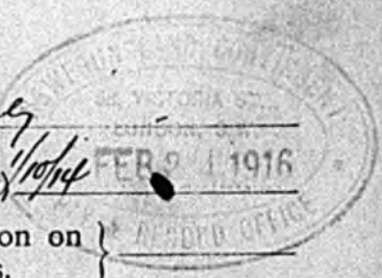
