CONFESSI ON OF DESERTION & FRAUDULENT ENLISTMENT.

I, No.M/416541 Pte. G. Manning of the Army Service Corps Mechanical Transport do hereby confess that I was No. 16453 Pte. Gilbert Hayes of the 3rd Battalion Duke of Wellington's Regiment stationed at Preston Camp, North Shields, that I deserted from that Regiment on or about 15th September ~~21st~~ 1915, and that I fraudulently enlisted in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment on the 5th May of December 1916 and that having been discharged from that Regiment under Para. 392 XVI K.R. I fraudulently enlisted in the Army Service Corps at Leeds on the 17th day of October 1918.



Manning states that the entry on his A. F. B. 179 referring to his enlistment in the Canadians is entirely incorrect. He states he has not served in the Canadian Expeditionary Force in any capacity.

On the strength of Major Parsons report and in view of this Soldier's reduced circumstances, payments totalling £15.0.0 have been made to him and it is urged that his case may be reconsidered.

He has now obtained employment through the Comrades of the Great War Association, please.



I was discharged from the 2/1st (Royal) Newfoundland Regt. on the 24th, September 1917 suffering from Asthma & Bronchitis, exaggerated by my Service in the Army. On discharge I was awarded a gratuity of £1.13. 1d. Pension to be settled by the Pensions Board. I resumed my occupation at Sea in the Merchant Service" as a Cook but was discharged from my ship in Buenos Aires, South America, as unfit for duty, suffering from Asthma & Bronchitis. Three weeks ago I tried to re-enlist at the Corn Exchange, Sheffield, but was informed that 'Crooks' were of no further use. They gave me position on the staff of the M.N.S, where I am now employed. The wage I receive is only £2.0.0. per week is not sufficient for a married man with a family. Therefore I write to you as an Englishman who has tried hard to do his bit in this wide world struggle for Adequate Compensation based on my pre-war earnings of £3.0.0. per week which I am unable to earn now. I joined the above regiment on the 5th December.1916. at St Johns.

And I received my discharge on the 24th September.1917. from Barry Camp. Scotland, unfit for further Military Service. .

During this period I was not receiving any allowance from the "Newfoundland Government" for the support of my Wife and later on the 11th June.1917 for my child.

My attention has been drawn to this, by a letter and form which was sent to me from the Pay and Record Office, Victoria Street.LONDON. which asks me to complete the said form, and return it to the office.

During the time I was in Newfoundland I rendered service to the country, by writing recruiting articles which appeared about four times a week in "The Star" and "Evening Telegram".

I also went on recruiting tours to Pouch Cove, and later in January1917. undertook a journey to Trinity Bay and English Harbour, from where I brought fifteen recruits.

For evidence of this I refer you to Adgt. O'Grady and Major Montgomery who gave me permission to write these articles for the Newspapers.

The claim which I consider I have against Newfoundland is one of nine months Separation Allowances for my wife and 9 months Service Gratuity, also three full months Allowance for my child Aubrey, born on the 11th June, 1917 at Sheffield, England.

To be fair I may say I am in receipt of a Temporary Pension of 6/10d from the Imperial Government for Partial Disability.

But however this is not Newfoundland. The claim which I have against you is for Separation allowance, 9 months service gratuity and 3 months Babys allowance.

The Imperial Gratuity which I received i.e. 10/- does not cover the 9 months in the 2/1 Newfoundland Regiment.

I leave my case in your hands, as under the circumstances I cannot see you in person. Trusting you will deal fairly with the above claim and statement.
