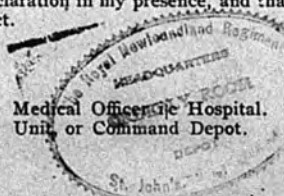

In reply to your letter of March 13th forwarding a letter from Mrs. Fanny Manning of 10 Barron Street, concerning the case of her son, No. 687 Private Peter Manning.

I would state that her claim for Separation Allowance has been considered by the Board of Review, but they are unable to grant the allowance because she has two other single sons ages 21 and 27 both of whom are contributing. The claim shows that prior to enlistment of this soldier he was contributing about \$4 per week; and during his period of service he was allotting 70¢ per day, or \$4.90 per week. The claim states further that the other two single sons; namely, James and Stephen contributed weekly \$3.00 and \$7.00 respectively; a total of \$10.00. The soldier cannot, therefore, be deemed to be the sole support.

For your information I am attaching hereto a copy of the letter to Mrs. Manning from the Paymaster, the tone of which she objects to.

He told me on the letter I got from him that he was told I didn't need this money that I had two sons besides this boy that served 4 years in the Regt. and they were turning me in more money than this boy ever gave me before he went to the war. I take that as a big insult from a person like Mr. Howley. I would like to know who his authour his for this story. The two boys I have are the one his 27 yrs. old and he pays his board and the other boy he is only 19 years, of course I get what he earns all write when he can get the work, and this boy what was to war he is in Spain now this 3 months, and I have to pay \$8. a month for rent: and I have no husband and I don't get any widow's fees. I never went to look for it. I was going to give this affair up only Mr. Philip Raynes told me to go to you and said if there was any such thing as getting this money you would get it for me. I never got any of this allotment money while my boy was on the field which other women got it and they with their husband living. So I will be more than thankful to you if you will try and get it for me, as I am entitled to it, so I can't see why Mr. Howley is so much against me getting. I am not able to go out and work and if I was I would trouble about this money.


