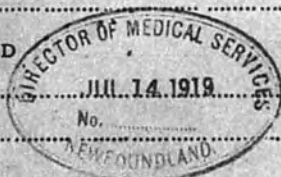

"I knew Manuel well, he was a Signaller attached to C.H.Q., and he was Missing on Aug. 22/17. He went out to repair a wire, and it was supposed he took the wrong one and went into the German lines. Not long ago we were told by one of our Officers - 2/Lt. A.J. Herder, that Manuel was a prisoner of war in Germany. It was between the 1st and 5th of November we were told. Lt. Herder had heard from Manuel's Mother that he was a prisoner. I left Newfoundland the same time as Manuel sometime in March 1915."
