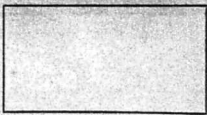

Would you kindly look up the papers of the Court of Enquiry on Sergt. Stanley T. Marks who was reported as a deserter in February 1915, and who according to rumour was a Germany spy.

I am investigating this matter through the Chief Constable at Ramsgate and the Secret Service at Scotland Yard. From the former I have received the following:

"I beg to report for the information of the Chief Constable that I have made enquiries respecting the marginally named man (Stanley T. Marks). I interviewed his mother who is a very respectable woman and resides at 8 Arklow Terrace, East Cliff. She informed me that her son Stanley enlisted in the Newfoundland Regiment in August 1914 and when on leave came to see her about November of the same year and remained for about 7 days. He then went away and she has never seen or heard of him since and is very anxious to know the whereabouts of her son.
