I am in receipt of your letter of the 22nd Aug. enclosing cheque for \$27.29 as final payment at date of discharge. You had not enclosed any discharge papers, nor do I know when my discharge dates from. I cannot accept cheque as final payment until I receive papers. We are entitled to be paid up to the time we receive our discharge papers.

I have also two claims to make against Regt. I understand we are entitled to ration allowance when away from the Regiment, and ^{some} rules & regulations - I had 14 days furlough from hospital & have been away from the Regt. since the 5th Aug when we arrived here. My second claim is for \$1 cents per day, cooking allowance that was stopped on me from the day I was wounded, and this amount & also amount of pay was entered in pay book before leaving Aldershot for the

D. Sidnell. My pay was entered in pay book as.
7 shillings per day. 5 shillings corporals pay + 2 shillings
working pay. This 2 shilling per day was stopped by
the pay office in London when I was paid up
on leaving hospital by whose authority I
cannot say. I understand we are entitled to
be paid this money as it was entered in
our paybooks. I shall be obliged if you
can let me know any thing regarding

On the 22 Aug. I received a communication from you, stating I was discharged from the 14th Aug & enclosing cheque for final payment. This I refused to accept & notified you to that effect. I also stated that I had not received any discharge papers. At the same time I made inquiries from you as to 50 kato per day ^{extra} cooking pay that had been stopped on me from the day I was wounded. To that letter I received no reply. On the 12 Sept I received a letter from you enclosing discharge papers. As I am not discharged until I received those papers I claim 29 days extra pay. I should also like to state that the discharge papers sent me are not properly filled in. I have never had a medical board, nor were any papers sent over for me. except from the doctor at the time who marked me up with an injury I never had, namely compound fracture of the leg. The time I served with the regiment is not filled in & the description

mentioned, describes me when I joined the regiment
not when this paper was filled in. This paper
as made out renders me liable to be called
up at any time & if I have to be
discharged I intend being discharged for good
Another point I would bring to your notice
is that no separate character sheet is
given, but "military character good" is written
across discharge paper. I understand that
nothing but the description & reasons for
a man's discharge should be on the discharge
paper & a separate sheet with a man's


