

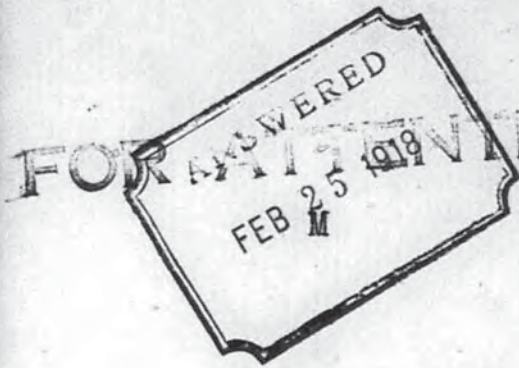

I, however, bring the letter to your notice for your information and for such action as you consider to be necessary.

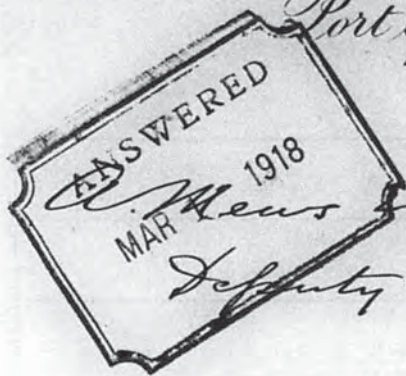

of age i.e. 21 when he enlisted and his foster parents were very devoted to him. But it appears that after he went overseas his Father Israel Marsh made several applications to the Authorities and succeeded in obtaining part of Mr. Marshes assigned pay, which was subsequently stopped. However I am of opinion that it would be altogether unfair to Job Marsh and wife if the memorial card went to Israel Marsh to whom it is directed, and as Job is almost incapacitated through failing sight it would be unfair to him if he does not get an allowance etc. of his adopted sons death in action.

Dear Sir,

I regret to inform you that your son, No. 2083, Private William L. Marsh, who was officially reported Missing on October 12th, 1916, is now officially believed to have been Killed in Action on that date.

I desire to express to you on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy in this time of sorrow. We feel the loss of loved ones, but it will, no doubt, be some consolation to you to think that your son willingly answered the call of King and Country, did his part nobly, and fell, facing the foe, in defence of the principles of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty. Though he has laid down the earthly weapons of warfare, he now wears the Soldier's Crown of Victory, and his name will be inscribed upon the Glorious Roll of Honour, and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen. When the victory is won and Peace again reigns upon the earth, it will be a comforting thought to you that in this glorious achievement he bore no small part.

I trust that you may have the Grace and consolation of the Great Father of us all at this time.
