or amounts were paid by you on
account of this man.

Copy of your Allotment Pay List
shows: Payments to Nov. 22, \$30.00.
To whom was this paid? I under-
stand the Patriotic Fund advanced
\$20.00, does the \$30.00 include
this advance? Also did the Pat-
riotic Fund receive \$5.00 as
authorized in Martin's letter
19/1/15 enclosed in my No. 58?

This information required to
reconcile Martin's account. Martin
was stopped from 5/10/14 to 25/12/14
= 84 days = \$50.40. If you have
only paid out \$30.00 in all, then
Martin is entitled to a refund here
of \$20.40.

On November the 16th or 17, 1914
advance \$10.00 was paid on this
account ~~to~~ Kate Martin, per
Robert Martin. I don't know ~~of~~
^{how} ~~that~~ payment was made, but per-
sumably it was from petty cash,
and I haven't the faintest idea
where to look for a receipt for
it.

On November 22, the amount of
Allotment was calculated as \$30.00
and a cheque was issued to Mrs.
C. Martin, less \$10.00 advanced on
November 16th or 17th ^{for the} ~~for~~
face value of \$20.00, this cheque
was never paid over, it was later
made payable to R.H. Martin, but
up to a short while ago was still
in my hands. I took the matter up
and it was decided to use this
cheque for \$20.00, to cover an
advance which the Patriotic Fund
made to R.H. Martin, on the 4th
of December, 1914, this accounts
for the amount \$30.00.

(There was \$10.00 advanced
16th or 17. of November, and
\$20.00 repaid to the Patriotic
Fund, covering the advance of
December 4th.)

With regard to the \$5.00 to
the Patriotic Fund, the Committee
of the Fund did not think it quit
right, to accept the amount as a
donation, in view of the fact, that
the two Martin boys were serving
in the Regiment and that the amount
was payments for their services.

Dear Mr. Martin:

Re 192, Cpl. C.P. Martin.

I have received your letter of July 26th, and in reply beg to inform you that your brother, in Germany, is being regularly supplied with food and clothing from London. The cost is entirely borne by either the Newfoundland Patriotic Association or Government Funds, so that there is no occasion for you to consider sending parcels of either food or clothing. In fact it would be quite impossible for you to get anything through. The regulation supply is sent by us, and any surplus would only go to feed the Huns, which of course would not be allowed.

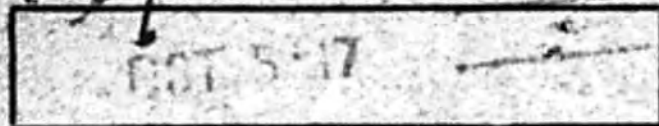

The Central Committee biscuits are coming regular and in excellent condition. My first bread arrived yesterday from Copenhagen in good condition.

Dear Sir as for my boots I cannot wear them they are too big and hard I exchanged them for a second hand pair. Could you send me size 7 - 6 something softer as my feet are not in the best of condition.

I also received two money orders, one was marked Pay and Record Office and the other was by the way of the American Express. I acknowledge the Pay and Record one and the other was acknowledged for me.

I also asked the Major if he could inform me if two of my personal friends, 123 Pte. Bernard Ryan and 2166 Pte. Charles Coles, both of my 2 platoons A Coy.

Capt. Montgomerie writes:

"There was drawn in this man's allotment paper, in favour of his mother, the sum of \$30.00, \$10.00 of which had been advanced, a cheque for the balance \$20.00

was issued, but before it could be dealt with, Mrs. Martin died, and the cheque could not be cashed, and as her son was under considerable expense for funeral expenses etc, and for taking out Administration papers, the Patriotic Fund advanced the sum of \$20.00. The Allotment cheque for \$20.00 is now in our possession. I return the Allotment paper. The present is to ask you to have Pte. Martin make his allotment up to Nov. 22nd, in favour of the Nfld. Patriotic Fund, and after that has been done, to advise us what his wishes are in the matter of further Allotments if any. I understand that his two brothers are out of work, and are now trying to enlist in the second Contingent."

This man's case formed the subject of your Memo. of the 18th. and mine of the 23rd. inst.

I assume if Pte. Martin amends Form 295 in favour of the Nfld. Patriotic Fund to the 21st Nov. = 50 days @ .60 = 30.00

To make it up to the 22nd. of Nov. as contemplated in Capt. Montgomerie's letter, that is to make it inclusive, would give 51 days, which would of course produce \$30.60, instead of \$30.00 as required to reimburse the Nfld. Patriotic Fund.

I enclose original form 295 and if Pte. Martin agrees, an endorsement in the following terms ^{should be} made across the body.

" I, No. 192 Pte. C. Martin hereby amend the within allotment in favour of Nfld. Patriotic Fund for purposes of refunding the sum of \$30.00 advanced by them for reasons stated in extract of letter from the Deputy Paymaster, which I have read and approve of.

I am returning Allotment Form No. 295, with the necessary endorsement duly signed, making payment of \$30 to the Newfoundland Patriotic Fund.
