The debit balance of £23:16:4: (/\$115.90) shown on Company Pay Books for period ended 26/6/19 and presumably brought forward into the Pay Books of Draft No. 91 has been amended as the result of errors discovered in Martin's account prior to receipt of your telegram.

Enclosed is a complete statement of this soldier's account since 17/1/19. Martin has in all probability overlooked the fact that he was paid £18:6:7: apparently on account of Clothing Allowance and Pay 5/2/19 and also an advance of £5:0:0: 11/4/19, while his account was still in debt.



The reason of the first payment was that she had applied for demobilisation in this country, stating that he had no dependents in Newfoundland. On applying at this office for completion of his discharge papers the false statement was observed and he was sent back to the Depot under escort. You can now credit him with the difference between the balance brought forward in the Draft Pay Books at 27/6/19 \$115.90 (£23:16:4) and the amount shown on the enclosed Last Pay Certificate £16:13:1; which is a correct statement of his account at that date.

Dear Sir:-

I respectfully ask the attention of your Department to my case. I was a member of the Regiment for over two years and returned to Newfoundland from Active Service on July 1st. instant. I am married and have four children.

Owing to some amounts being charged up against me, particulars of which can be ascertained by you from the records, I find myself in the position at present that I am practically in want. The \$250.00 War Gratuity given me had already been eaten up in debts accumulated whilst I was away. Through my requesting on the other side to being demobilized and consequently outfitting myself at the time with clothes and other expenditures I was called on to pay an amount of \$150.00, and in addition to this the allocations to my wife, amounting to about \$38.00, were stopped. The result has been that instead of having this additional amount to my credit when I arrived here I had my gratuity reduced by that amount.

I should be grateful on behalf of myself and my family if you would give your best consideration to my case, as I feel that the result will be your arranging to comply with my request and allow me some additional amount.

No. 4119 Private G. Martin, late Newfoundland Regiment, called here this afternoon to see the Governor concerning a grievance which he thinks he has. Particulars are as follows:-

Joined Regiment November, 1917; Proceeded to France 1918; where he was gassed and wounded; in February 1919 he was demobilised in England and given \$60 for Civilian clothes and \$30 for first 28 days leave, making \$90 in all. However 4 days after being demobilised and whilst on leave, the Pay & Record Office cancelled the demobilisation and ordered Martin back to Winchester; In due course he was repatriated and demobilised here in Newfoundland on the 1st of July, 1919.

Martin complains that he is out of work and without money and that the \$90 in question has been ^{wrongfully} ~~wrongly~~ stopped from his pay and from his wife's separation allowance from February to 1st July, and he has been informed that he is still in debt. I have told him to go and see you and I should be obliged if you will look into his case. By the way, he tells me that his Gratuity of \$270 has been paid.



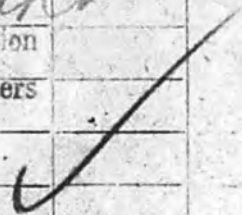

No. 4119 Private George Martin, son of Mosey Martin, Hr. Grace, enlisted on the 14th Nov., 1917; was discharged on 29th July, 1919. In hospital V.D. 24th Nov. 1917, 15th Jan., 1918, 8th August, 1918. Applied for demobilisation in United Kingdom stating no dependents in Newfoundland; discharge granted; afterwards cancelled when false statement became known. Returned to Depot, Winchester under secret. Applied July, 1919 for War Service Gratuity ~~to~~ to repair property in Harbor Grace; \$150 paid. Applied July 27th for balance War Service Gratuity, stating that previous advances had been used in settling debts contracted by his wife during his absence overseas; nothing further allowed owing to large debit balance. Granted general educational course on August 1st for three months, which he abandoned on August 21st of his own free will to take position on "Rosiland"; advanced \$10.00 by Dr. Blackall which has not been repaid. Applied for course to be continued as "Rosiland" project was given up; course continued to complete three months; followed by one month at Navigation Academy, with about three weeks overtime. Admission fee to Long-shoremens' Protective Union paid by Civil Re-Establishment Committee. Position secured as Seaman on "Rosiland" Dec. 4th; he failed to turn up. Position secured as Seaman on foreign going vessel Jan. 30th.
