Howley, Archivist, alleged to be endorsed by Mrs. Alice Martin, and I now forward you District Inspector's Byrne report thereon. I also return the Cheques in question, together with statements from Mrs. George Martin and her husband, and the correspondence in this connection.

Sir:-

I respectfully report for your information, that I have made a full investigation into the matter, in relation to a separation allowance cheque for \$150.00, drawn in favour of the wife of George Martin in 1919, which cheque has been endorsed by some other person other than Mrs. George Martin, and cashed on the 4th. of June, 1919, at the Canadian Bank of Commerce.

On September 26th., 1930, George Martin, on behalf of his wife, made a claim for the amount of \$150.00, and sent the said claim to Mr. J.M. Howley.

On April 1st., 1931, I interviewed Mrs. George Martin on the matter, and she positively denied ever receiving any cheque for more than \$42.00. She was positive that since she came to this country in 1917, she received only two cheques, or at the most three. She was also positive that she didnot endorse the cheque for \$150.00.

On comparing the handwriting of Mrs. George Martin and her husband I concluded that the signature on the back of the cheque for \$150.00 was written in George Martin's handwriting.

I interviewed the manager of the Canadian Bank of Commerce, where I found that George Martin had been employed in said Bank as messenger in 1919; and that he made a deposit of \$220.00 to his account on the 4th. of June, 1919, the same day as Alice Martin's two cheques, one for \$42.00 and the other for \$150.00, were cashed. The signature made for the Bank was exactly similar to that endorsed on the back of the \$150.00 cheque.

Being convinced that George Martin endorsed his wife's cheque for \$150.00, I sent for him to call at my office, where I placed all the facts before him, and compared his signatures on the cheques of his own, which were identical with that on the disputed cheque. He had no hesitation in admitting that it was his writing, and could not remember the transaction, but was quite satisfied he wrote that signature, and made a statement, which I now enclose.



Statement of George F. Martin

About Sept. 26th., 1930, after having a consultation with James M. Howley, in reference ~~with Gratuity~~ ^{to} Gratuity Cheque, for my wife's separation allowance, for the sum of \$150.00, due her in 1919, of which she had no knowledge of receiving. I made application to Mr. Howley, making claim against the paying record office for the above amount. Since then I am convinced that my wife did receive her separation allowance a cheque for \$150.00, for which I endorsed same with her consent; as it has been proven that I deposited her two cheques, one for \$42.00, and one for \$150.00, in the Canadian Bank of Commerce, on the 4th. of June, 1919, and I am quite satisfied that I have no further claim against the Paying Record, for any monies in connection with my wife.

I am the wife of George Martin
My husband is an ex-Soldier
I came to New foundland in
1917. My husband has been
receiving a pension of various
amounts. He always received
his pension Cheque himself
and signed for same with
the exception of one time
he was sick & the Cheque was
made out in my name for
\$32.50 in August or September
1930. I remember receiving two
other small Cheques & perhaps three
these Cheques was for something in
connection with the war, that would
be nine or ten years ago.

These Cheques come to me as Registered
Mail. A few months ago I was informed
that ex-Soldiers were in New foundland
receiving back pay. It occurred
to me that I had received
no money on that account,
but when I heard others had
been paid, then I advised my
husband to find out if I was entitled
to any money. & my husband made
enquiries & found out a Cheque for
\$150.00 had been had been issued
and endorsed Alice Martin
& Cashed. Then I claimed I had not
received \$150.00.
